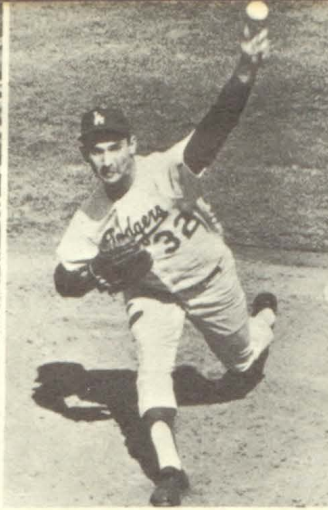

In his senior year Gary placed 12th in the District 18 Tournament.

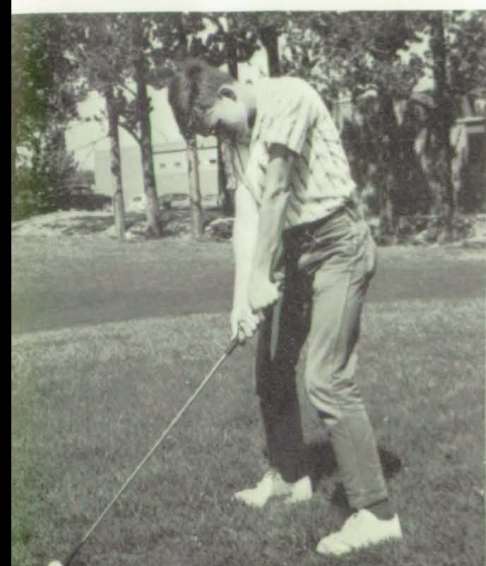

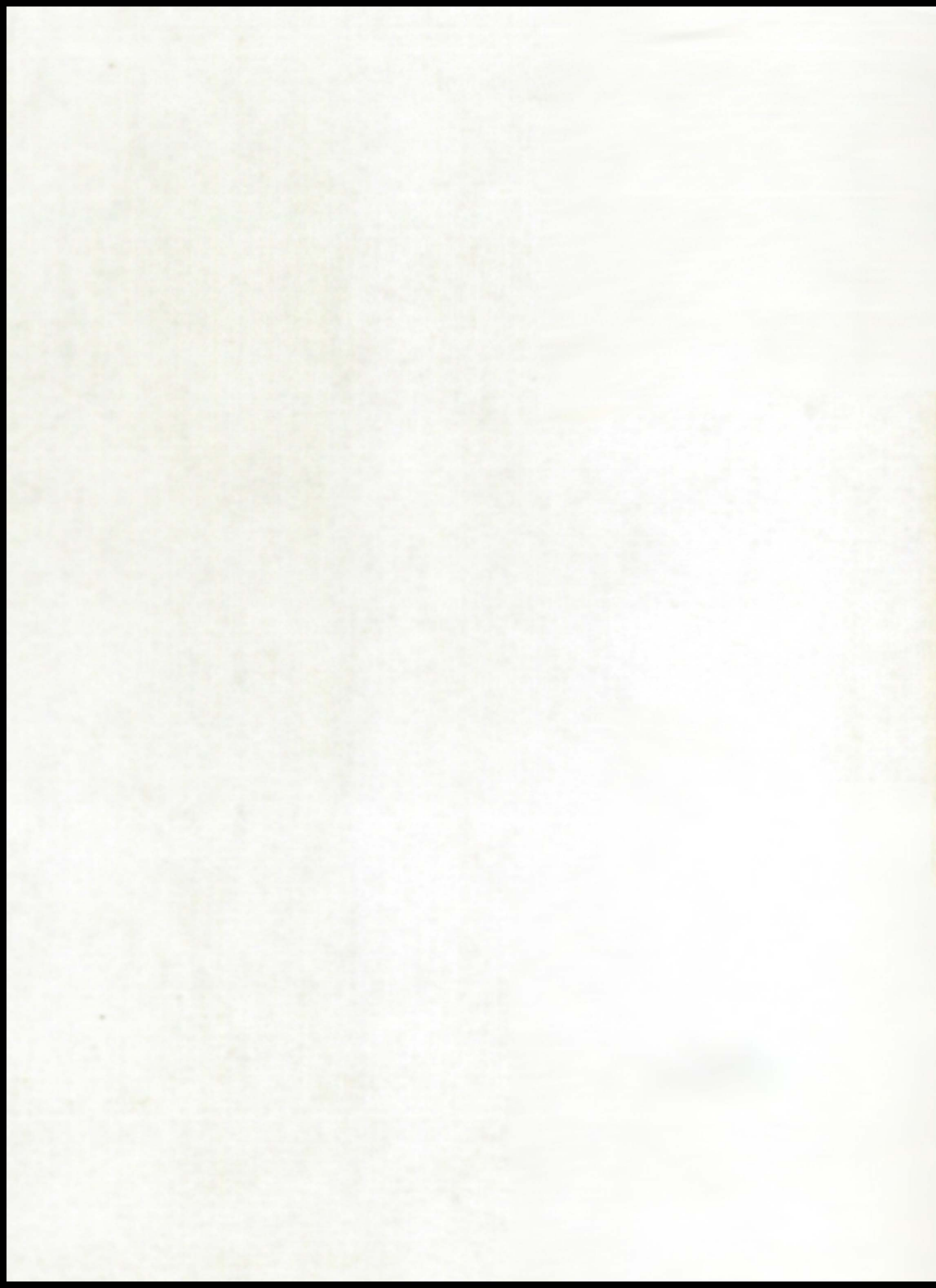

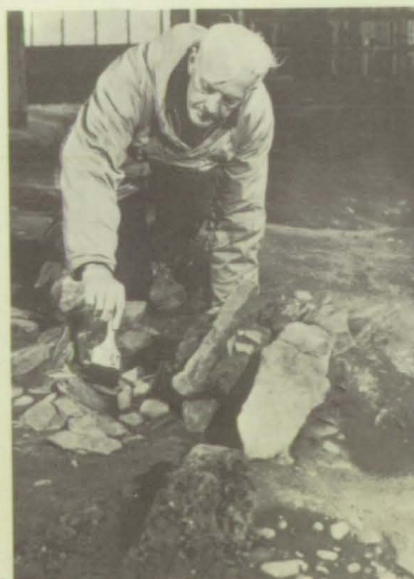

World Events in Review—1963



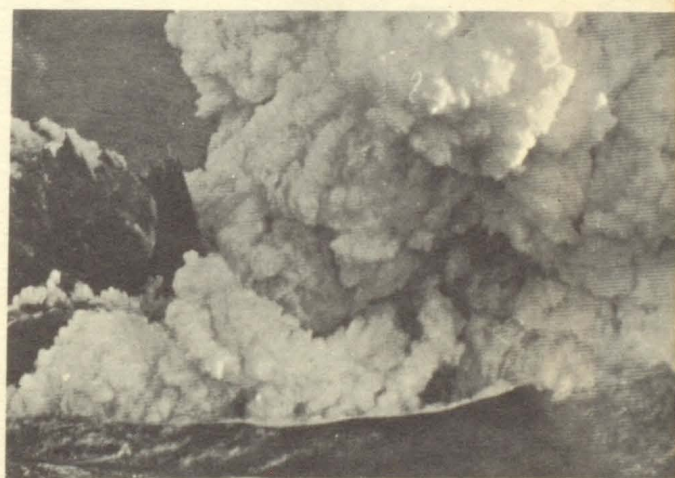
