"Last year it took until the third game for us to score. This time, it was the third play." That pass, a 51 yard bomb from Tom Gothmann to S. Joe Devins wound up the leading receiver and was named to the All-Conference team as was the chiefs' linebacker, Keith Schuler. Brian VanEyll lead in rushing and John Deleeuw showed unexpected strength as a field goal kicker. Highlights of the season included winning possession of the Brown Jug at Chaska as well as the Homecoming victory. The Chiefs' played with an emotional and physical intensity which stunned so called stronger teams, but inconsistencies in line play and some break downs of mental and physical discipline resulted in some disappointing losses. 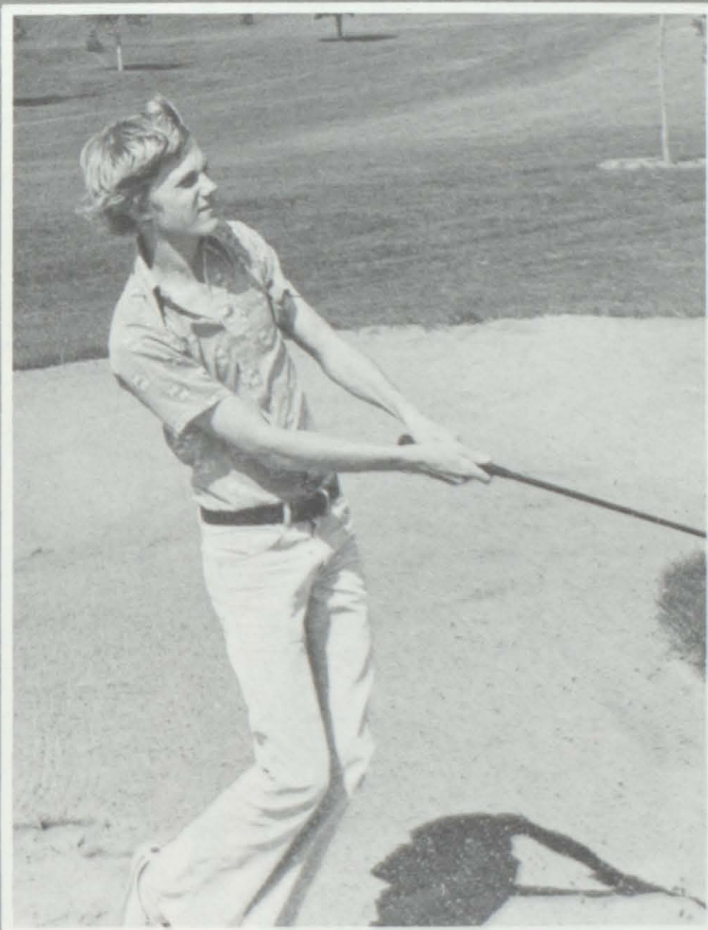
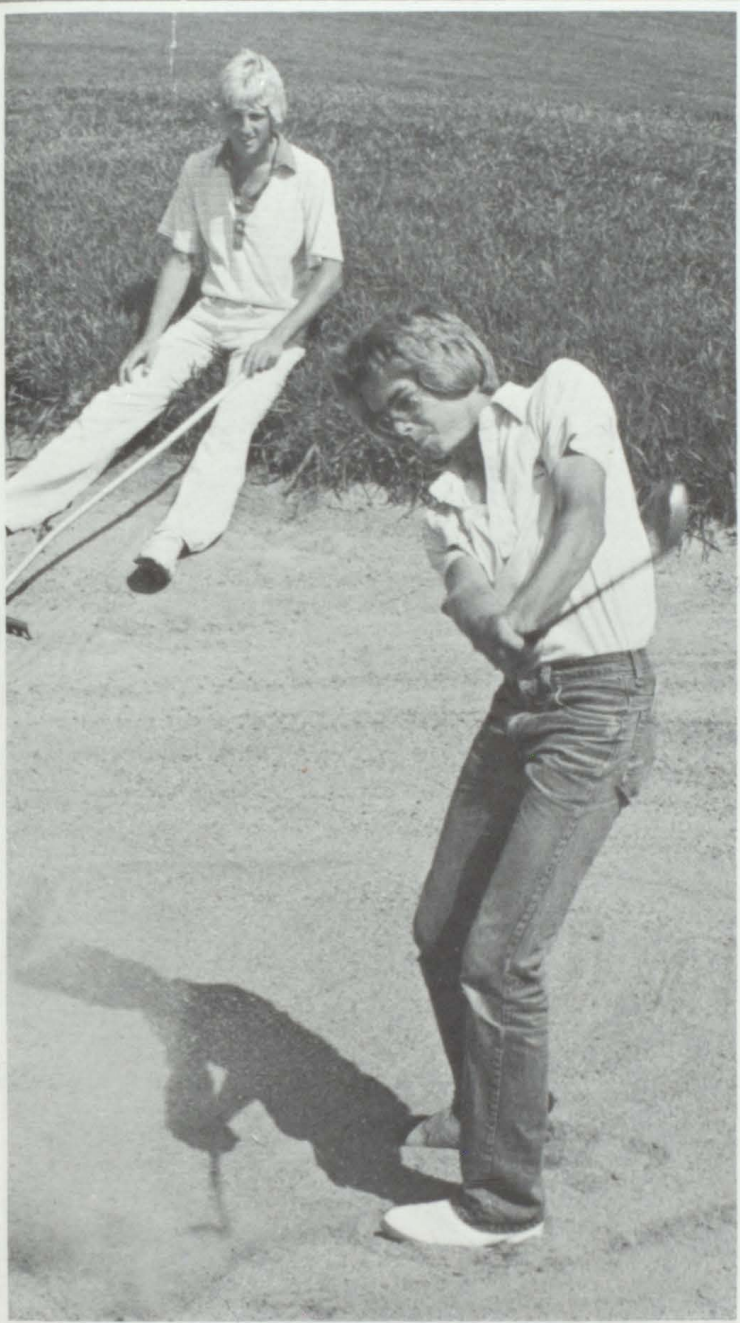


The Waconia Golfing Chiefs finished second in the Conference standings and second in the SWC Conference meet. So much for the slow start. In past conference play the veteran and still young Chiefs were favored to win the District 17A Tournament at Waconia Island Fiew. They did win, by 23 strokes. They were favored to win the Region 5A meet at Foley Wapicada. They did win, by 14 strokes. They were favored to win the State Class A meet at Anoka Majestic Oaks. They did win, by 9 strokes.

It wasn't really that easy, however. After winning the State Title a year ago the golfers naturally played under the pressure of being "defending champions." A championship effort was needed to overcome a 6 stroke deficit after the first day/first 18 holes of the meet. Their comeback (a 15 stroke turnabout in just 18 holes on the second day) provided a 9 stroke victory which at least equalled the excitement of winning by 1 stroke the previous year.

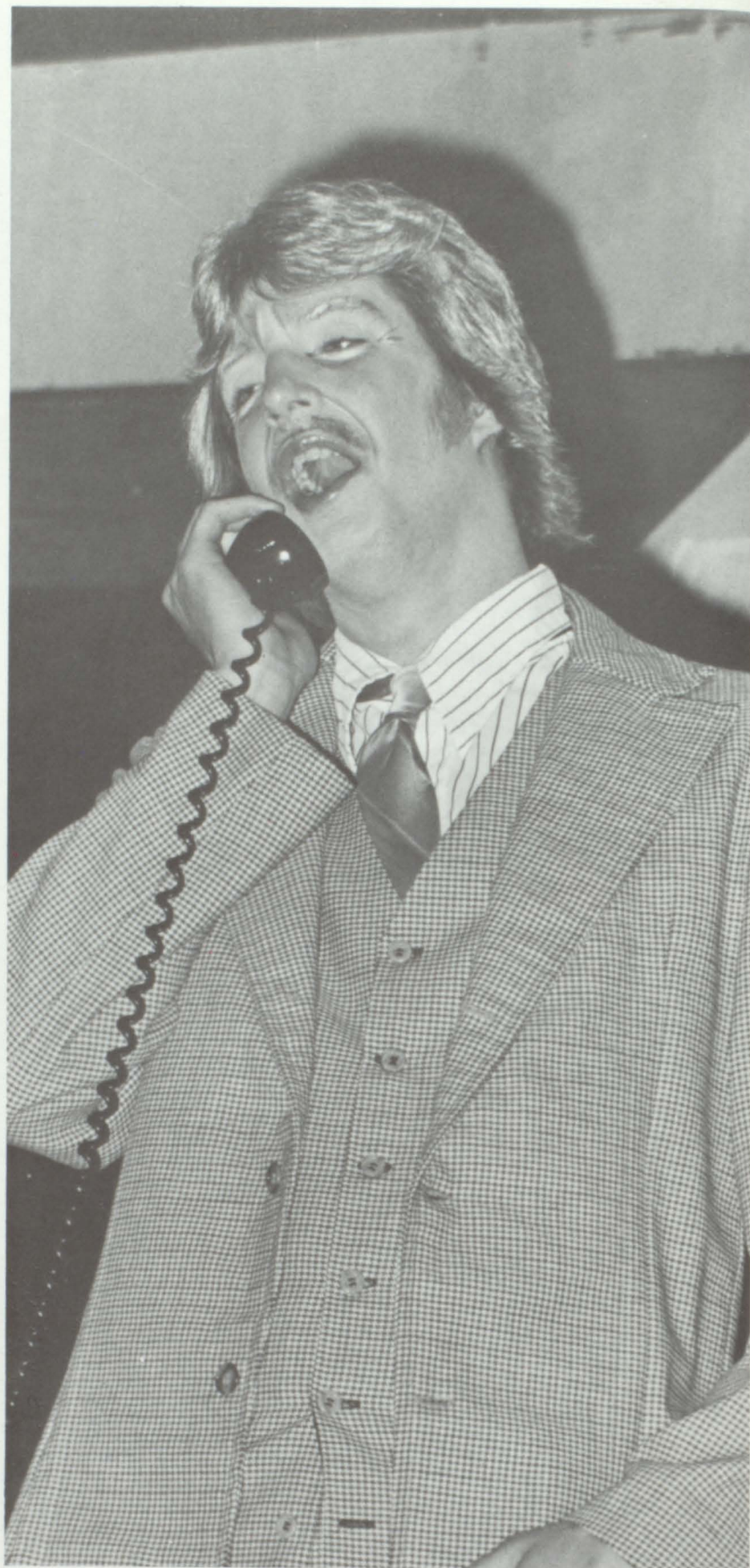
The team was led by Steve Oftellie who finished his Senior year as SWC All-Conference golfer, District 17A Medalist, Region 5A Medalist, and tied for State "A" Medalist (on that not so dubious basis he was awarded his sixth Varsity Letter in golf).
