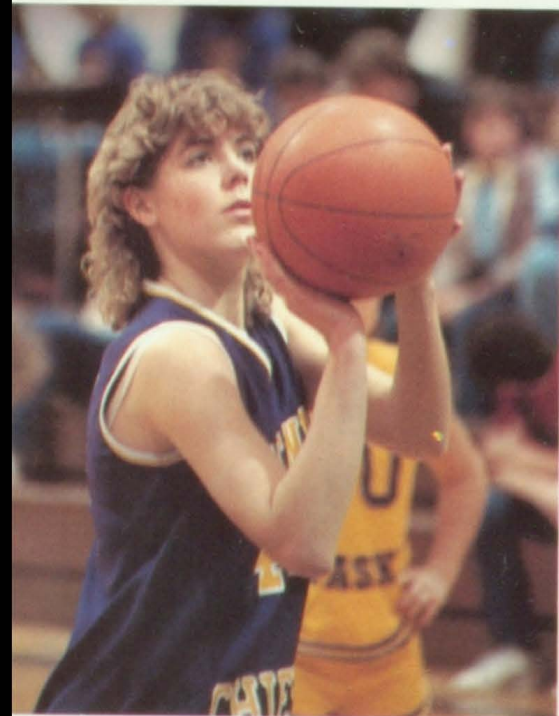

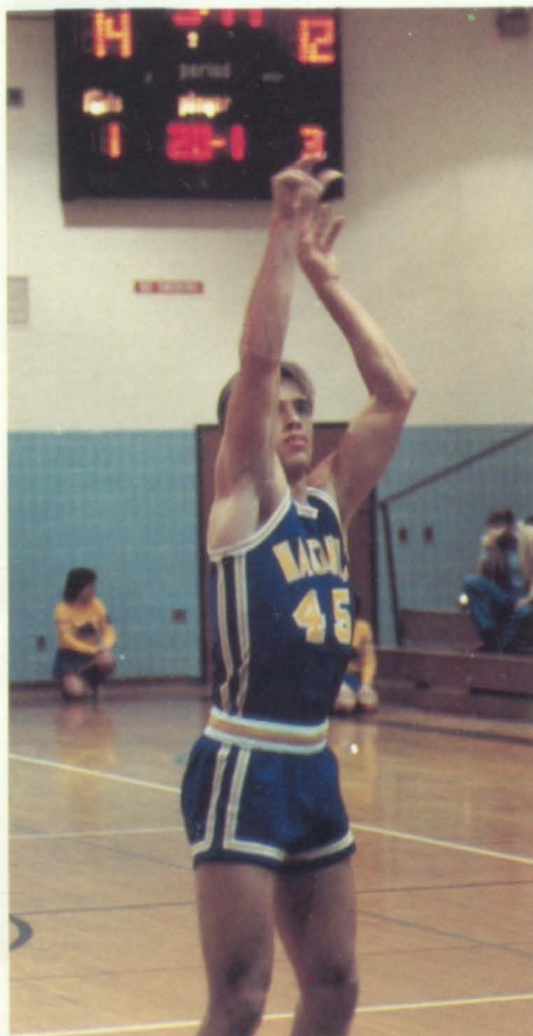

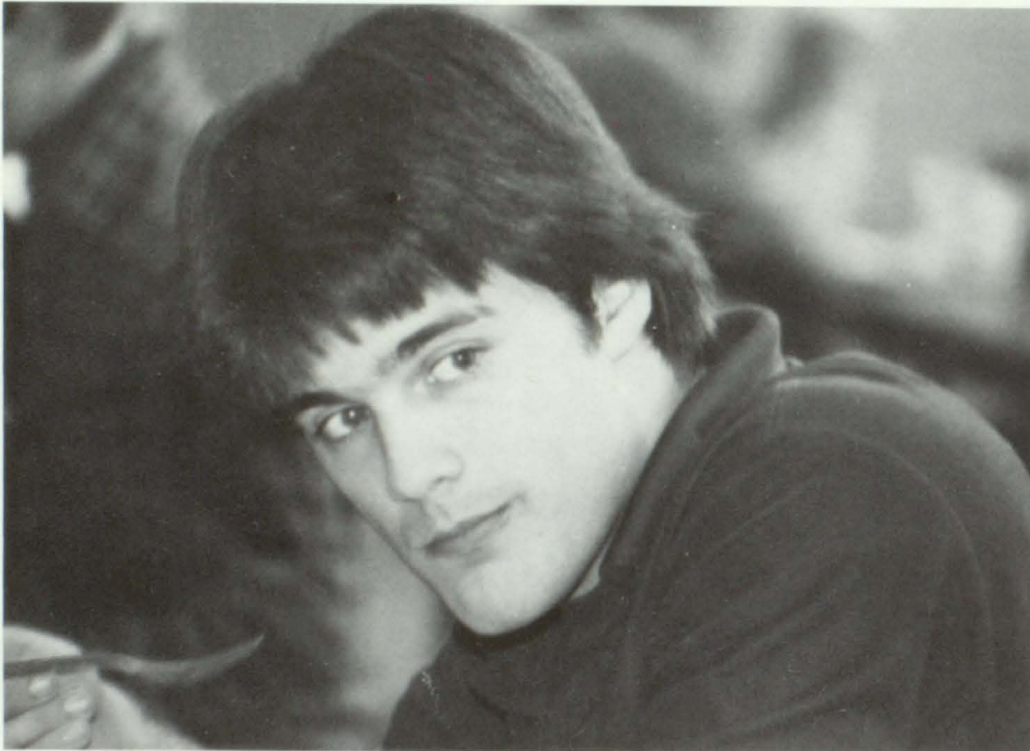

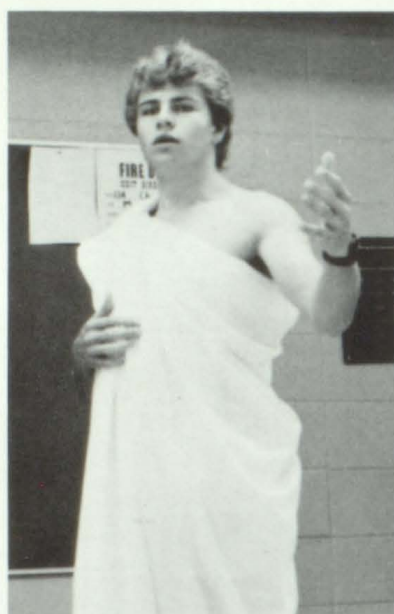

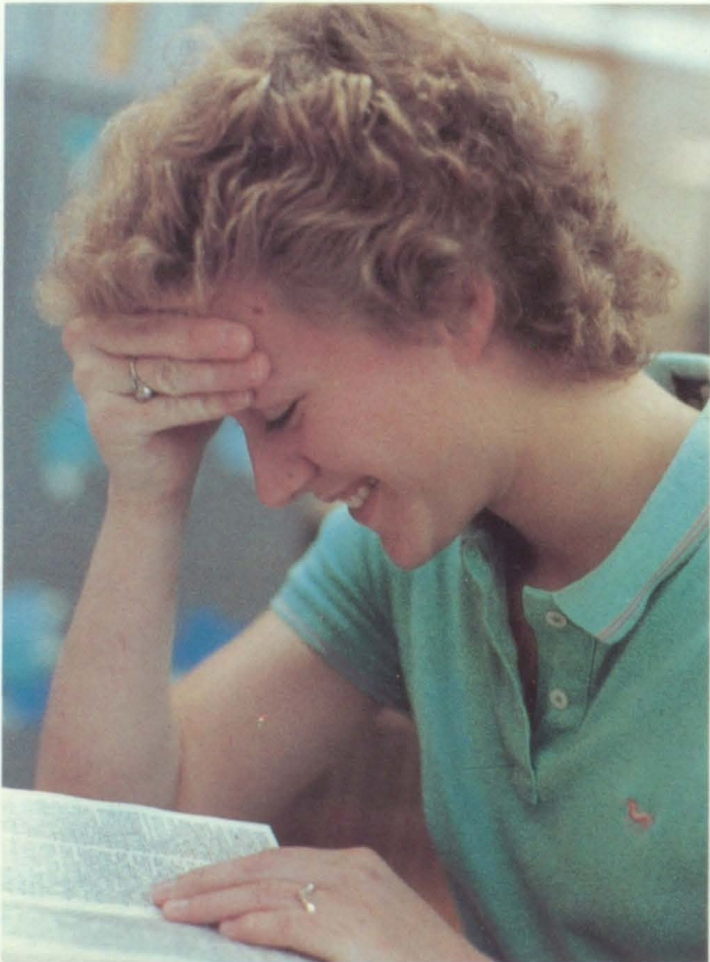

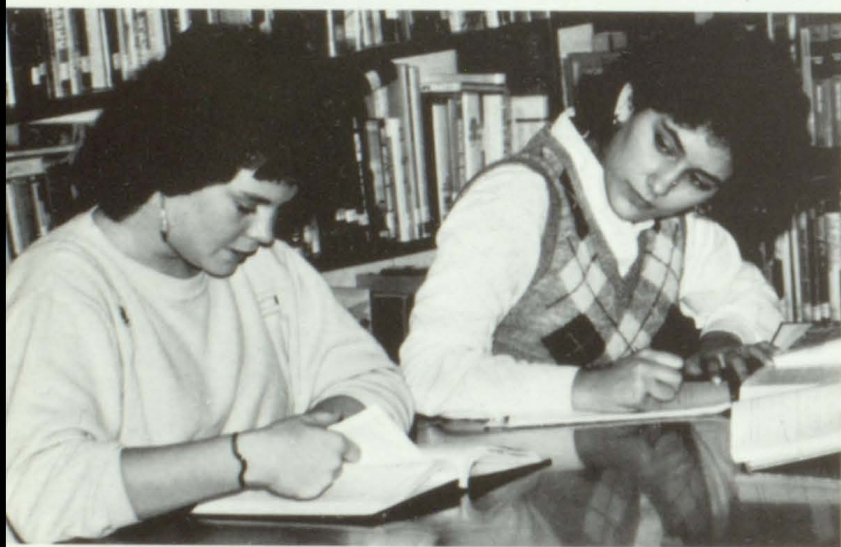

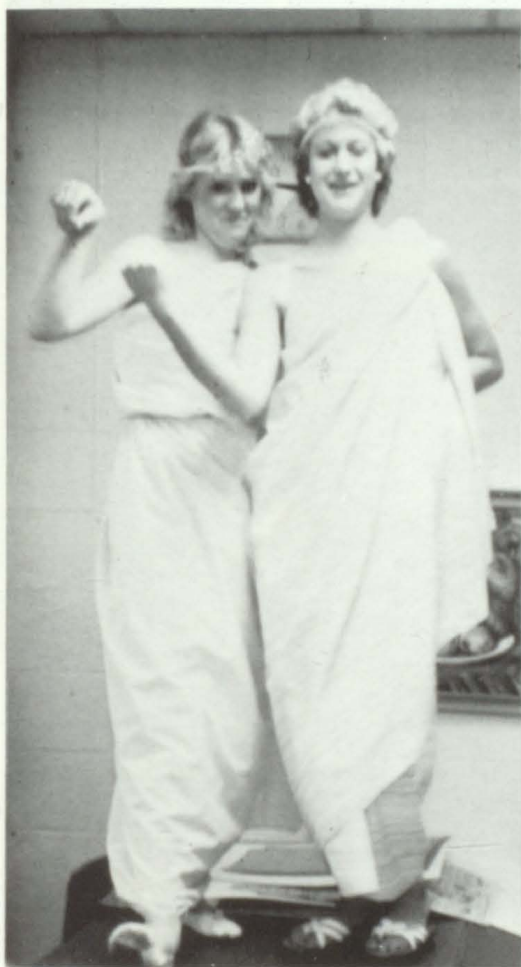

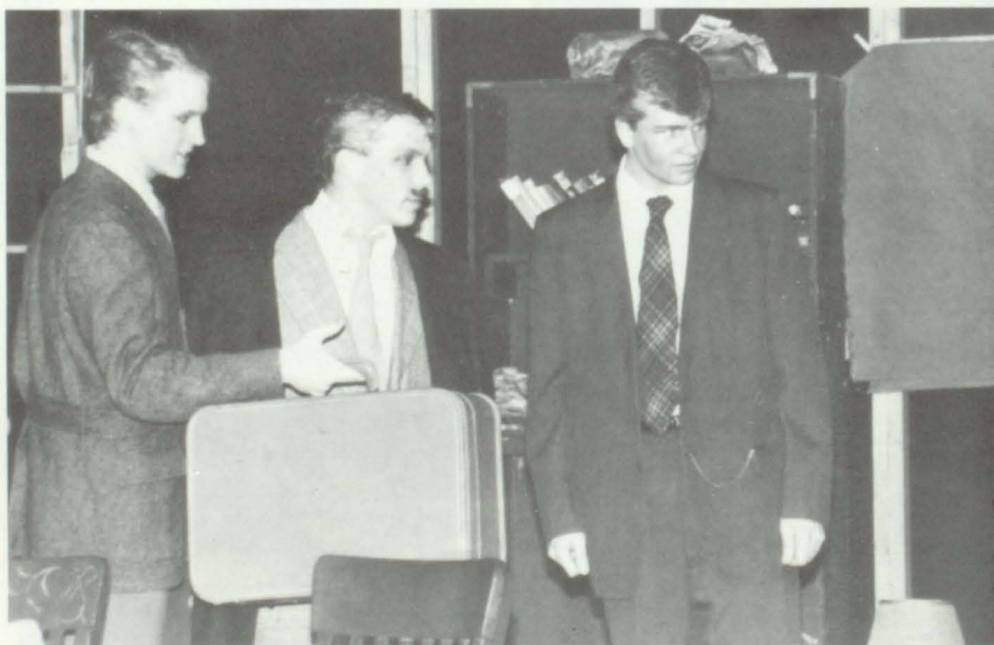

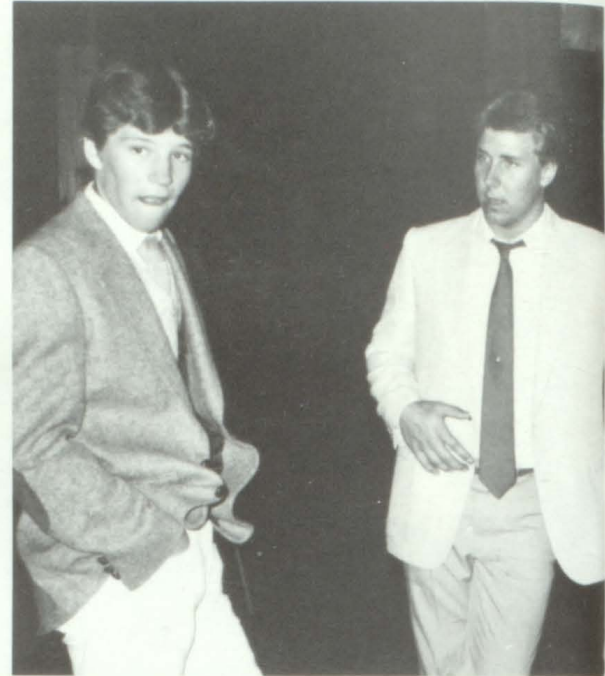

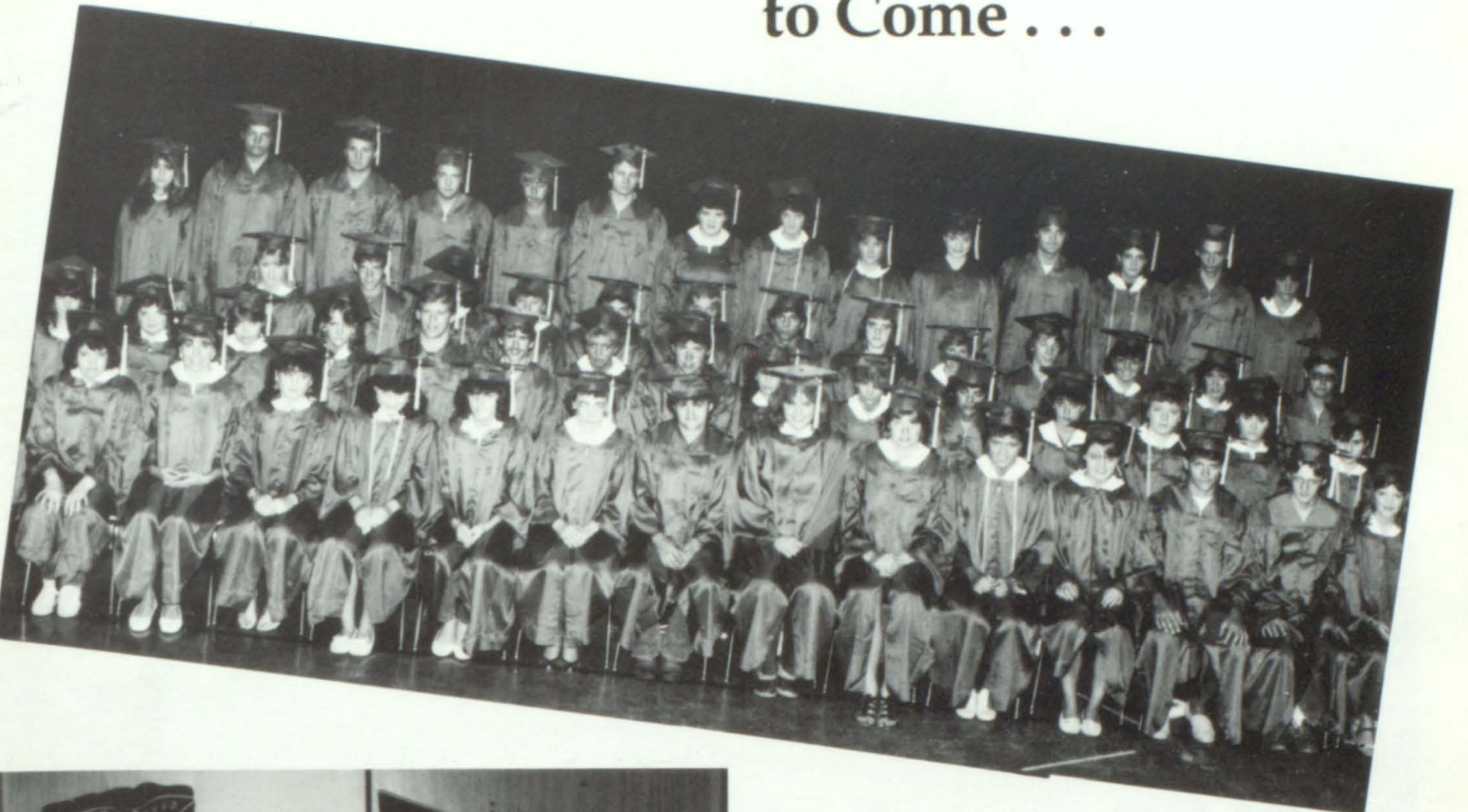

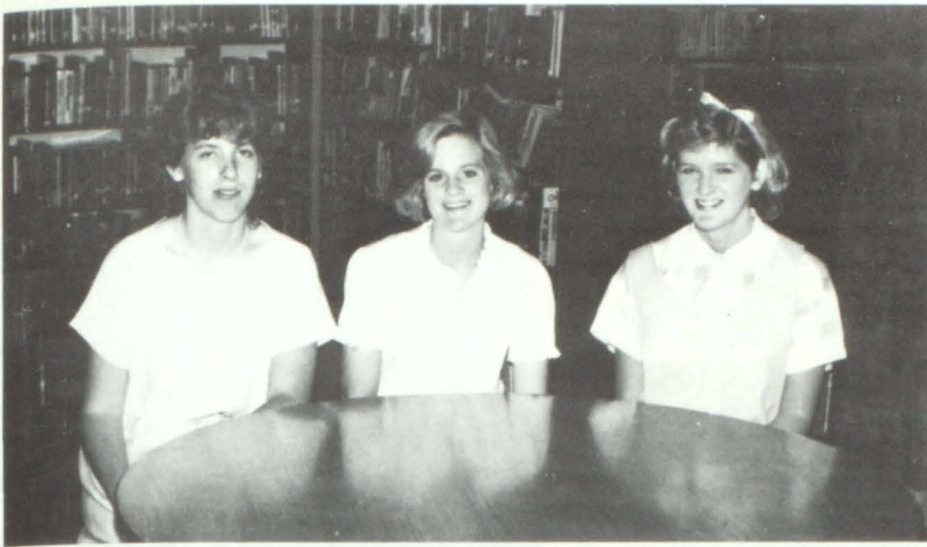

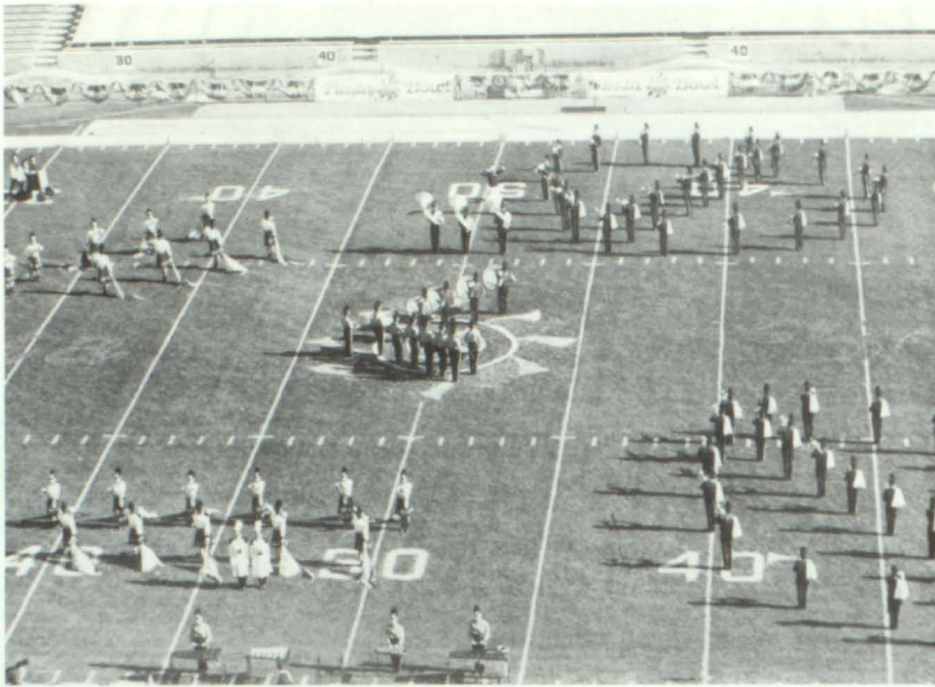

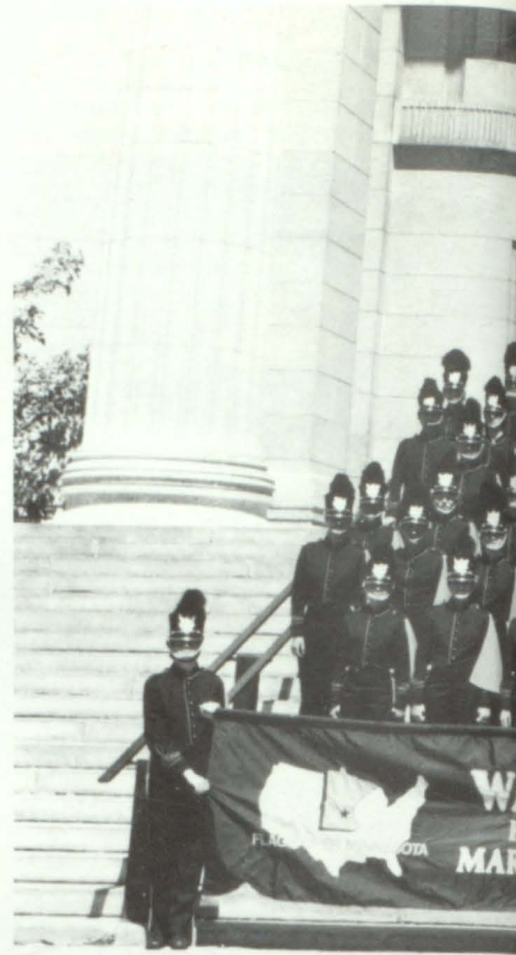

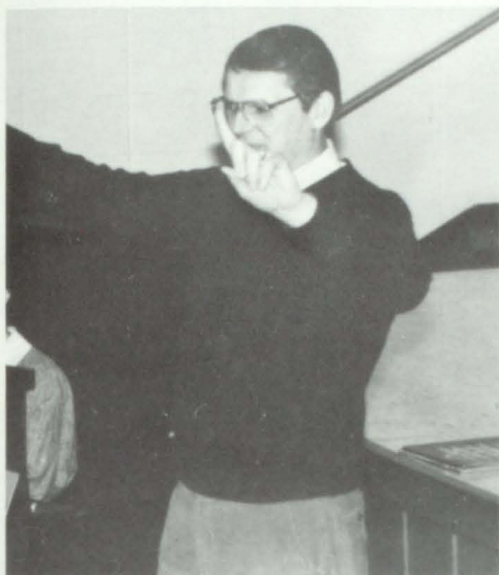

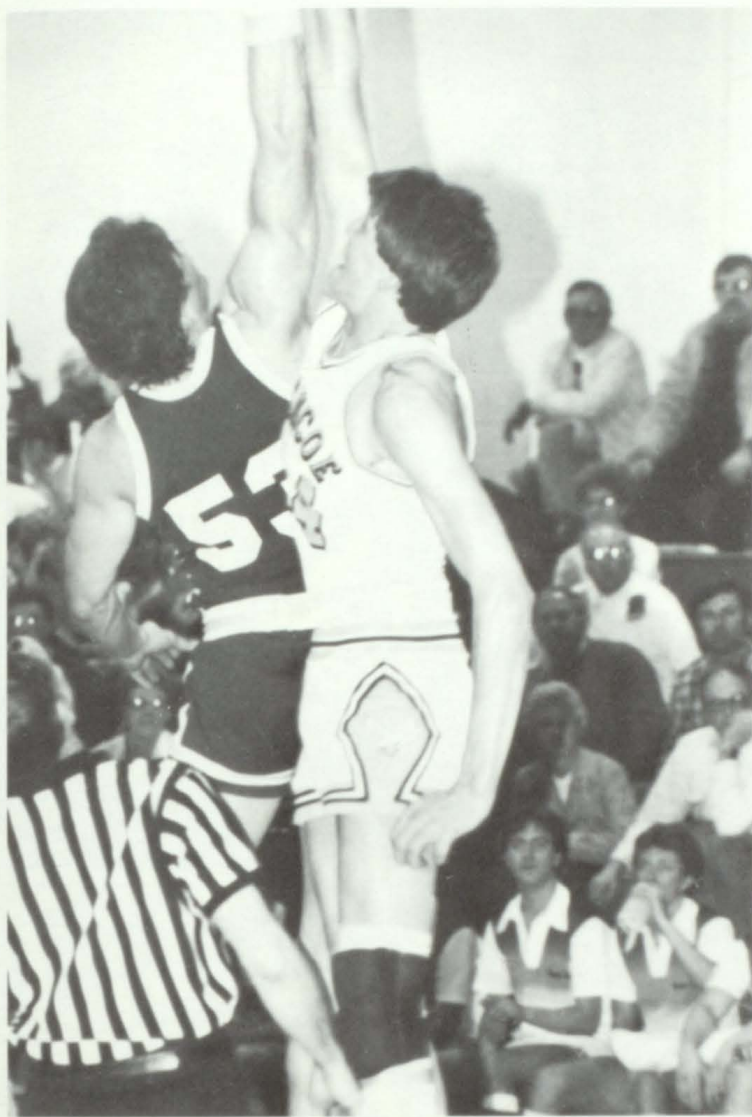

Many studentts at WHS are aware of the importance of fitness. Some diet to keep in shape, while others engage in various types of exercise.

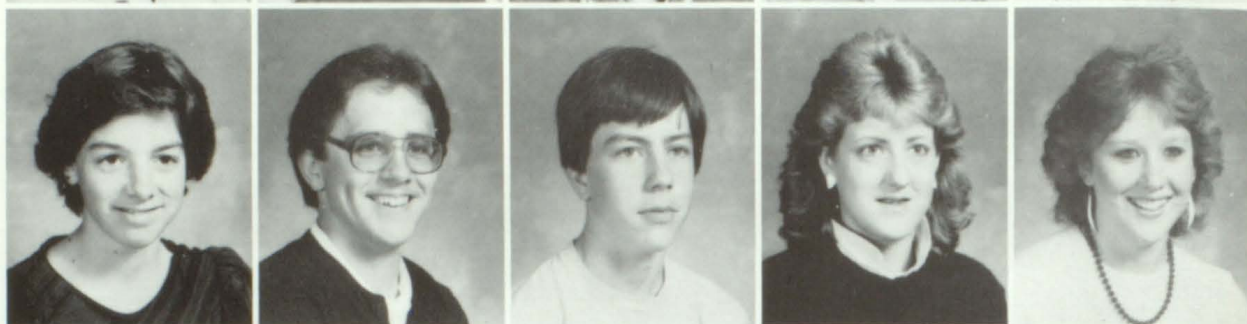
