


## Turn on the Night Light



























### **Chemical Health Week Focuses on Consequences**












### Second Year for Waconia High School Smoother


According to Mr. Fredericksen, the 1995-96 school year had a much smoother start than the first year for the new high school. Since the building was finished, it was much easier for students and teachers. There was less chaos, which made it easier for everyone to get used to the school.

Mr. Fredericksen feels that the high school has a positive influence on students. He said, "We try to stress values that are important, such as hard work, cooperation, and goals. We also try to recognize hard work and good behavior." VIP cards, which gave students privileges, was one way that good behavior and hard work were recognized. The cards could be used to receive free and discounted items from stores around Waconia.

One thing that Mr. Fredericksen anticipated was the four-block schedule. He felt that the new schedule would "improve curriculum, and add up to 20 more classes." It would also "change teaching ways and make more hands-on work possible." Parent meetings, spending time with the current eighth and ninth graders, and teacher training were all ways that the school planned to prepare for the 1996-97 school year. A positive occurrence for the district was the November 7 passage of the discretionary levy that will provide continuing funds for the schools of the district.


### Social Classes Cover Broad Topic Range







According to head coach Pat Foley, the football team had a great season going 5-3 and finishing third in the conference, after being picked to finish last.










### **Boys Complete Perfect Conference Record**




### Girls' Successful Season Has Outstanding Start










