



Where Were They Then?

that time!





Reflecting on the Current Status







Sarah Gibbs - Grade 12

- Q: What will your generation most be remembered by? A: Probably the war and terrorism.









rest of America displayed patriotic colors for the mourning country. United and standing firm, students demonstrated the pride that comes with being a citizen of the United States of America.











Safari Island Benefits the Community





New Principal at Southview Meet Mrs. DeVaan

In 2001 Khuzana DeVaan became the new principal at Southview Elementary. As a bright new addition to District 110, she brought many new ideas to the school. The yearbook staff interviewed Mrs. DeVaan, and we talked about her past, how she felt about working in Waconia, and her plans for Southview Elementary.

Q: How many years have you been a principal?

A: Five years, four years in Sioux City, Iowa and this is my first year at Waconia.

Q: Where else have you worked besides Waconia?

A. I worked in the Cleveland Public School District and in the Minneapolis School District.

Q: Why do you feel District 110 is a good place to work?

A: The people, the students, staff, and parents make it enjoyable.

O: What are some of your highlights/achievements from the 2001-2002 school year?

A: Everyday I get to work with a strong, professional staff. The parents are warm and caring. Everyone is committed in the kids doing well; it makes it an exciting place to work.

Q: What are your goals for Southview Elementary in year ahead?

A: We will continue to have a strong academic emphasis and a positive caring environment.

Bayview Elementary School Meet Mr. Anderson

This year elementary school students were split up into two different schools. The yearbook staff talked to Mr. Anderson, who is the principal of Bayview Elementary about the split, the changes in the former middle school, and what's ahead for District 110.

Q: Why was the elementary school split needed?

A: The former elementary school was of the largest in the state. At Southview there were about 800 students. Now at Southview there are about 505, and at Bayview there are about 320.

Q: What good things did the split bring to the district?

A: There are fewer kids so we can have smaller class sizes. That gives the kids more of a personal learning experience.

Q: What changes were made to the former middle school to accommodate elementary school students?

A: For Minnesota state code, we had to add sprinklers everywhere. We tore out interior lab room walls and added common areas. The band room turned into the music room, we leveled the floor. The bleachers were taken out of the gym, and the floor was redone. The library was redone, some high school kids helped with that. There was a new indoor playground put in.

Q: What is in the future for District 110?

A: The district will keep growing, a lot more houses will be going up in St. Bonifacius alone. We have a huge wooden castle playground going in. This playground will be designed and built by the community. With the growth in this district, we will be offering more programs for everyone in the future.






Activity Classes Engage Students



Waconia Students Gain Practical Skills



Practical skills included classes in Math, Business Education, Industrial Technology and Family and Consumer Science. Required classes included Math Connections I and II, as well as Keyboarding. Many electives, such as Personal Law, Calculus, and Intro to Windows were also offered. Some Industrial Technology classes included Intro to Drafting, Mechanical and Architectural Drafting Maintenance, Small Engines, Woodworking Technology. While taking these classes, students gained skills in construction, welding, and wiring, and learned how to operate and repair small engines and automobiles. Family and Consumer Science (FACS) classes included Housing and Interior Design, Child Development, Foods I and II, and Gourmet Foods. In these classes, students learned basic to advanced food preparation, how children develop and how to care for them. The skills students learned in practical skill classes are ones that they can use throughout their entire lives.









The Arts Inspire and Teach

The arts included all of the art, music, and theater classes Waconia High has offered. These classes allowed students to express themselves. Band, choir, music theory, and music appreciation were offered for students interested in music. Band was offered for all levels of players, the purple band was for less experienced players, the gold band was for the more experienced players, and the concert band was for the most experienced players. The choir had the same options. Some of the art electives were Drawing and Painting, Ceramics, Introduction to Art, Studio Art, and AP Art. These classes were a treat for students will all levels of artistic talent. For students interested in acting, a theater and drama class was offered, this class taught students all the elements of putting on a play. In this class students performed the play Romeo and Juliet and practiced acting out short scenes from television shows.



This past summer, the




The Fiddler in Waconia







Yearbook Staff Reflects Back and Moves Forward





Art and Literary Magazine Showcases Talent









up the crowd with their cheers and season updates.







Spring Fling Creates Spring Fever








Monet's Garden: Prom Impressions








Waconia Soccer Born in 2001





Epic Winterguard Looks to the Future





Waconia Girls Fire Up







Boys Basketball: It's about the Game








Some highlights of the season were beating St. Cloud Tech. 27-26, taking third at the Kiffmeyer










