Once again, Homecoming week was a success!

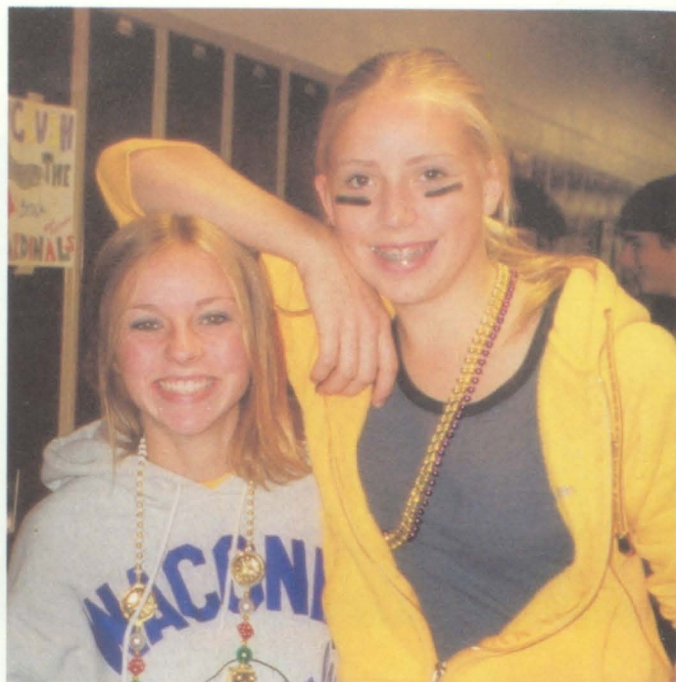

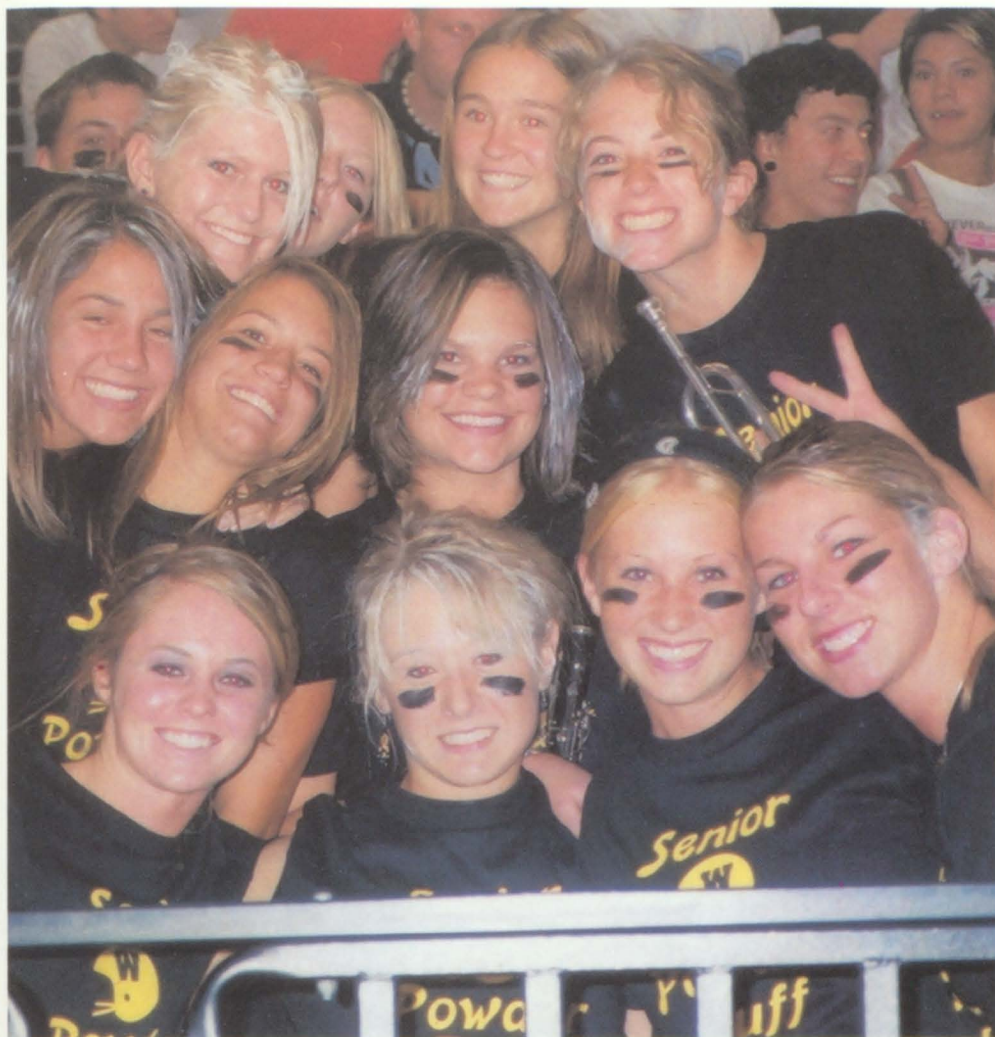

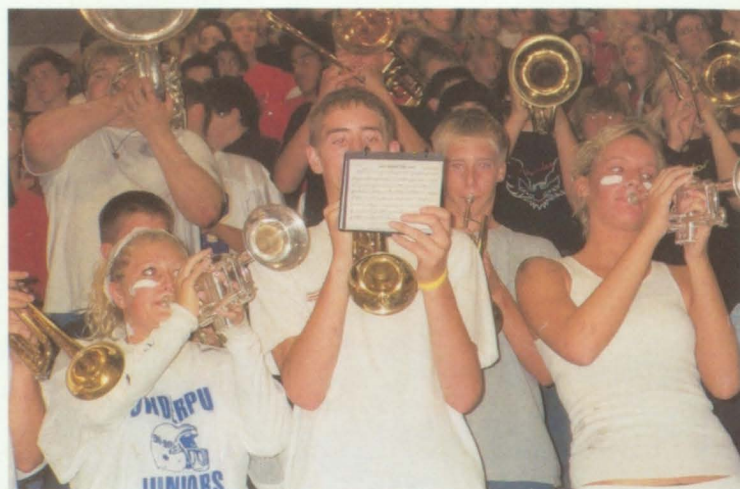
A HOMECOMING FULL OF SPIRIT

Another schedule change was switching from 4-quarters a year to 3- trimesters a year.

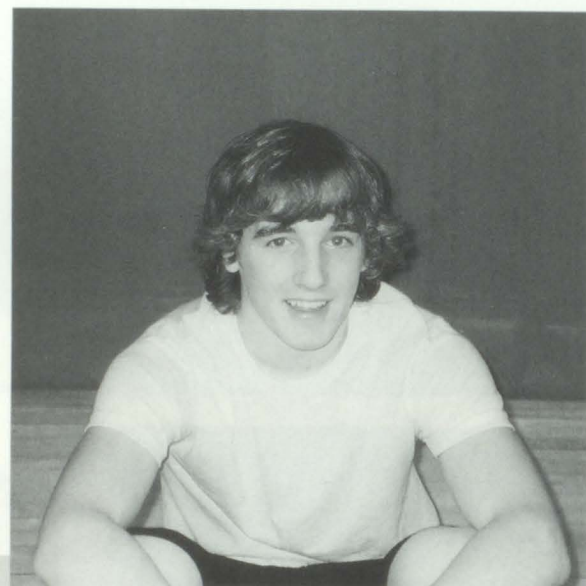
Though this new schedule allowed WHS students to have more classes in a day, it decreased the amount of classes students could take in a year.

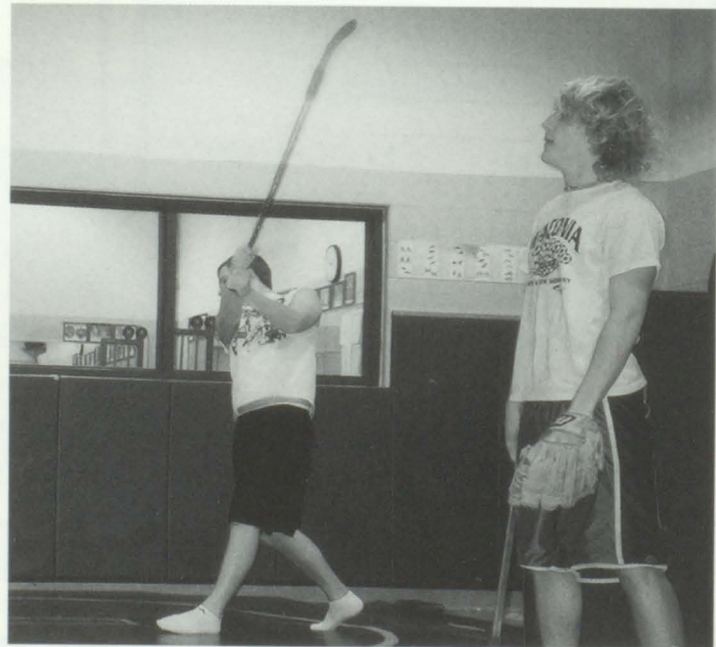
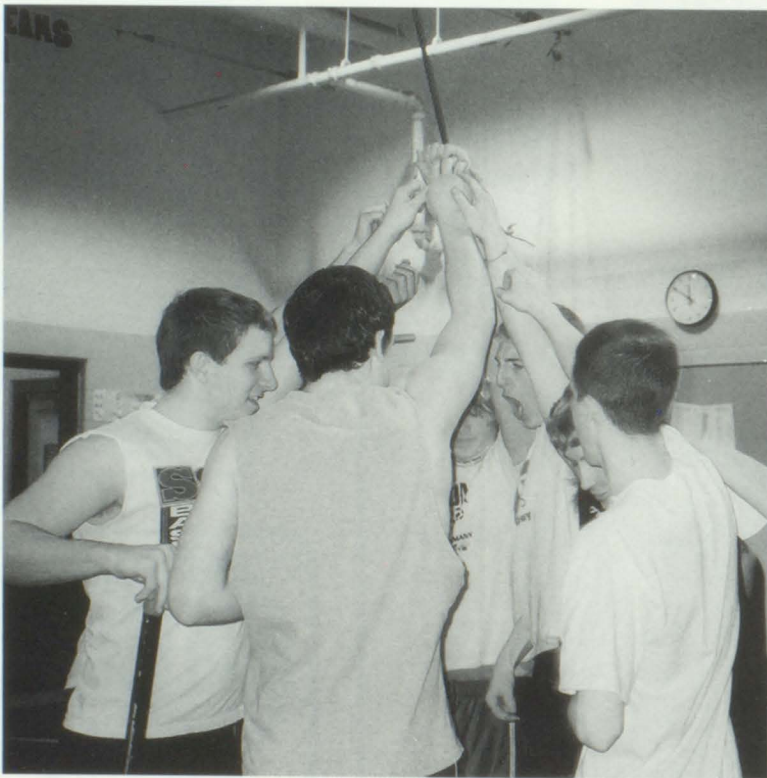
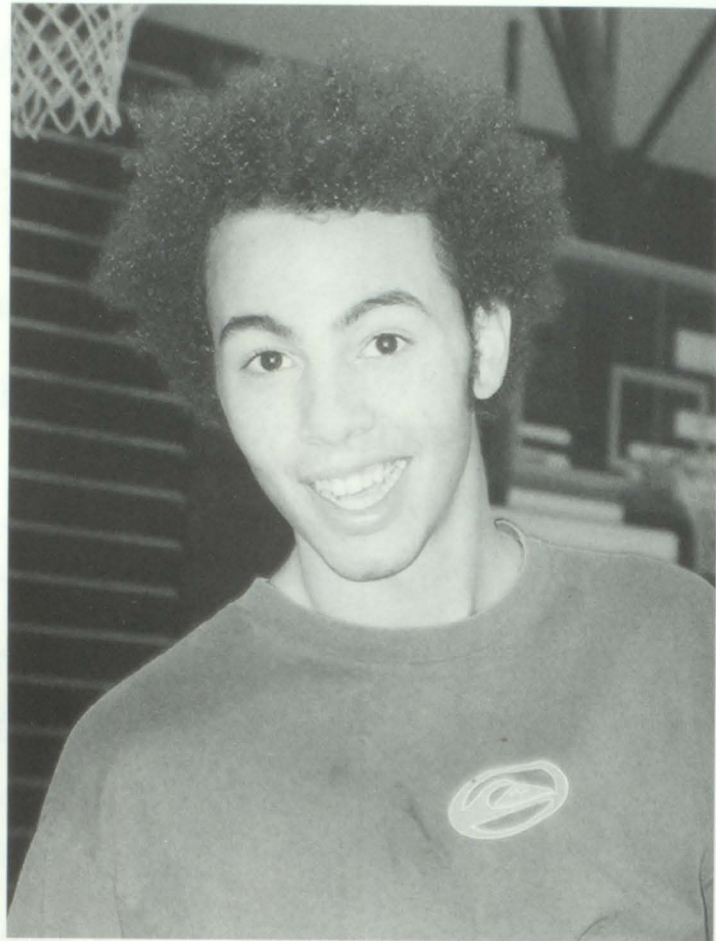
DODGEBALL

Mr. Hayes believes the class is so successful because of the limited number of physical education courses available to students and because students enjoy sports at

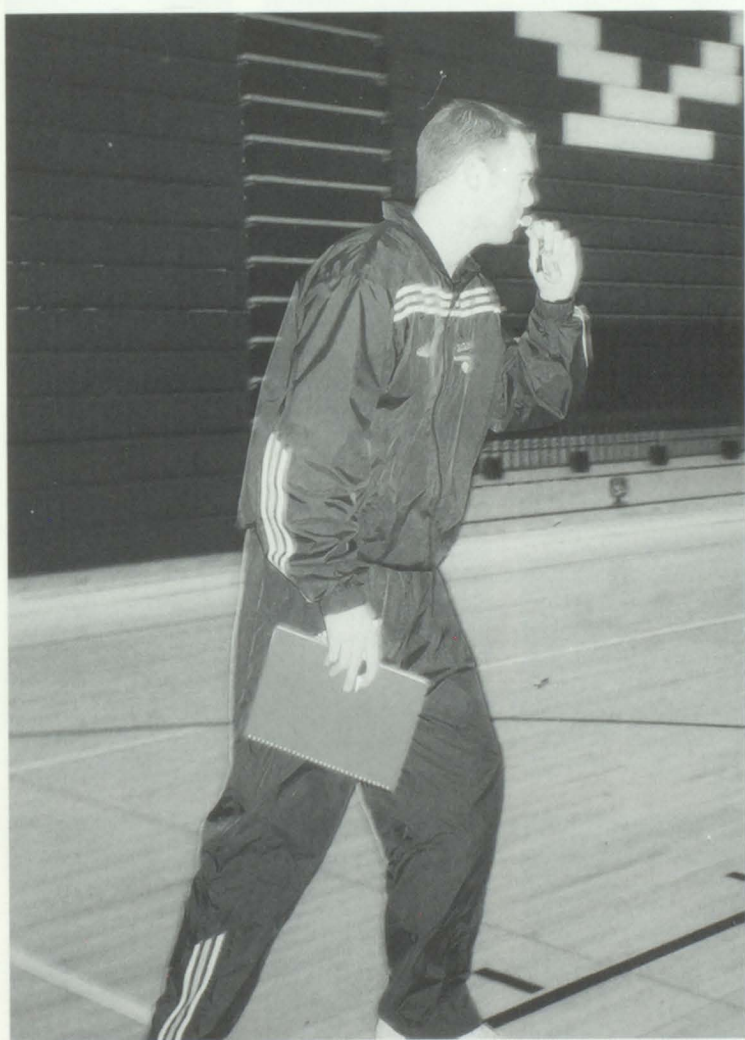
WHS and like the competition aspect of the class.

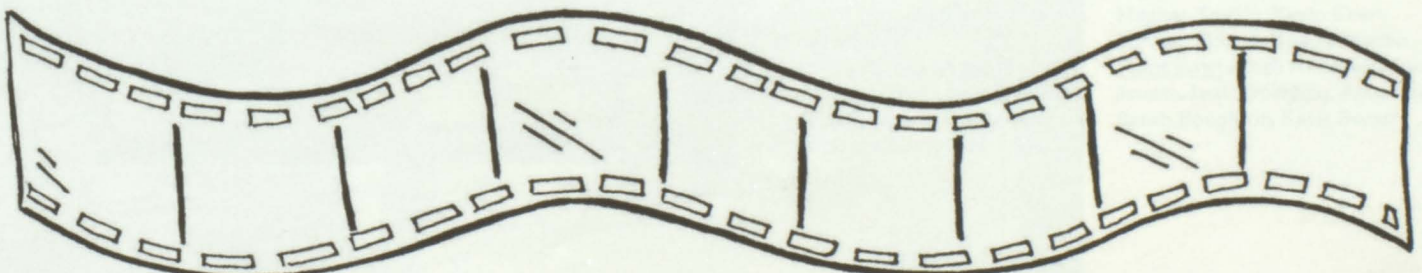

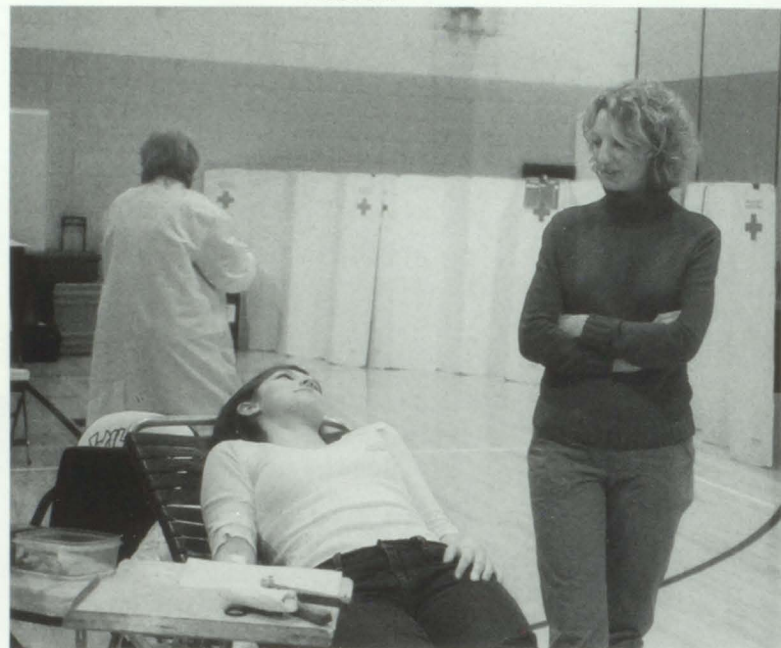
in the end everything comes together and turns out to be successful.

According to the groups advisor, Ms. Melchert, Student council is beneficial to the school and the kids involved have fun with it.



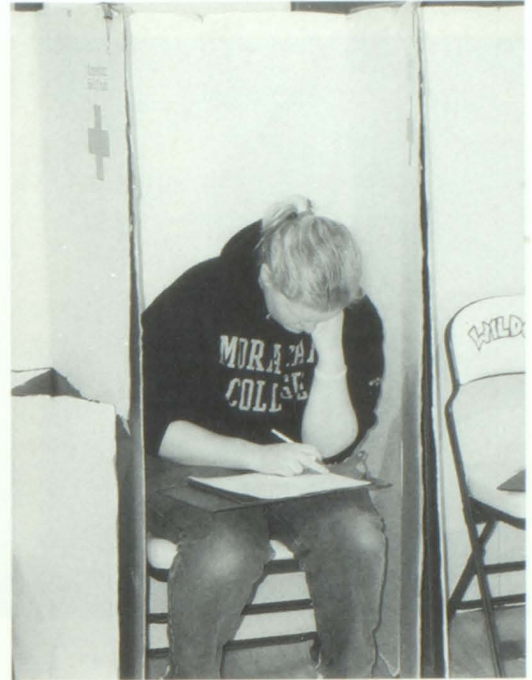
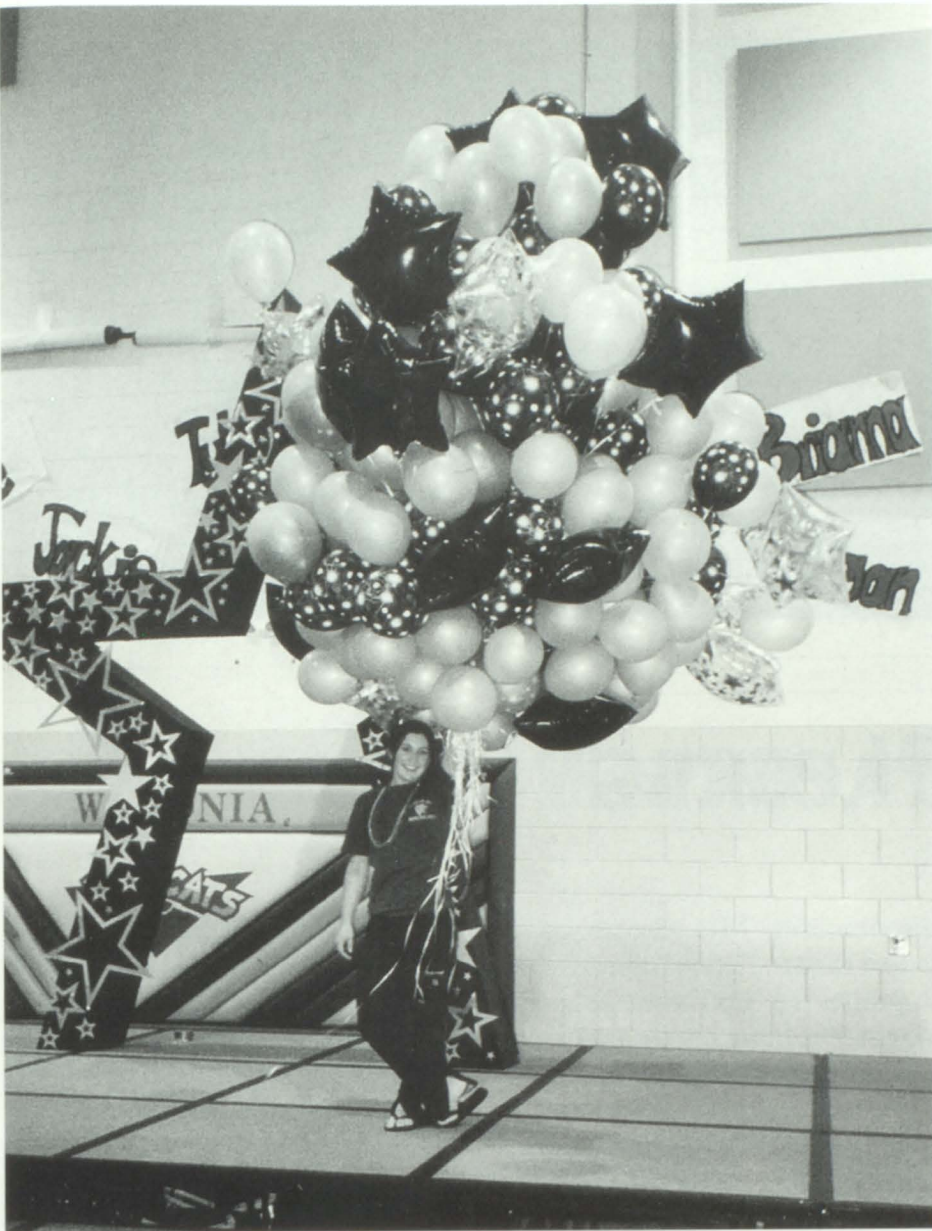

Tracks is a continuing success and a very credible source of new for WHS.



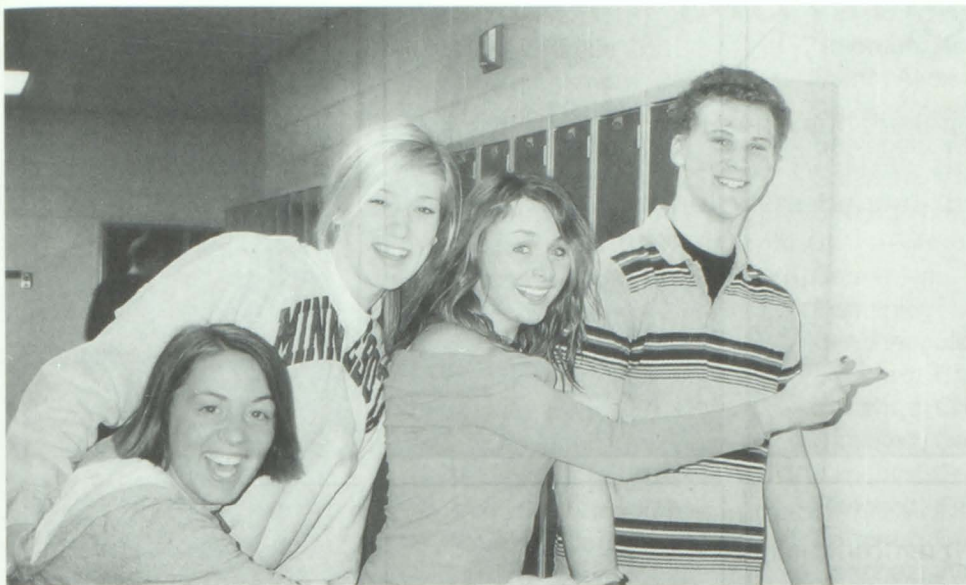

The yearbook staff's main goal was to document special events and highlights throughout the entire school year.

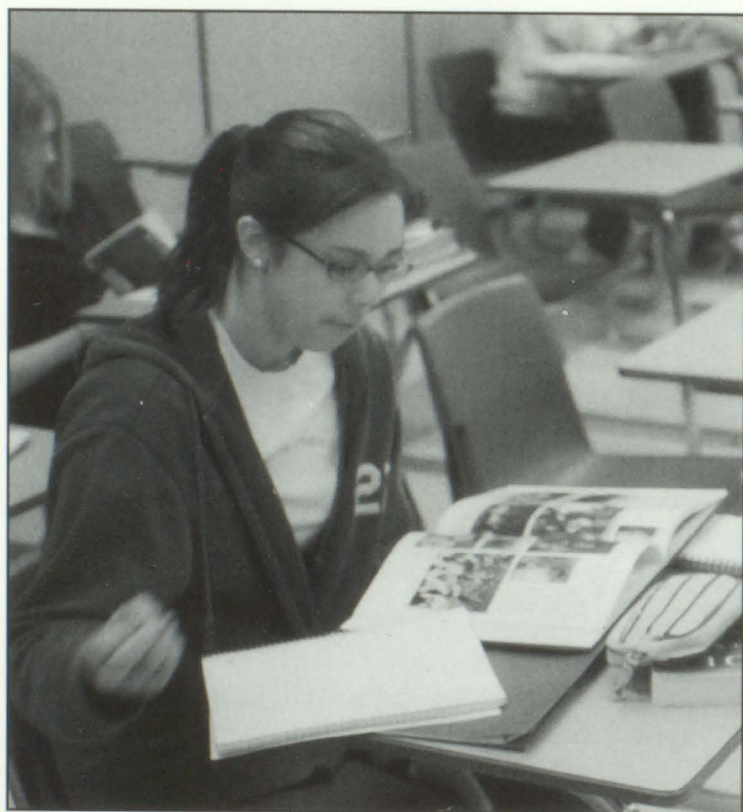
During class hours, students learned a variety of different yearbook techniques and later were able to use these

The yearbook staff worked hard to reach deadlines and brainstorm ideas for new pages.

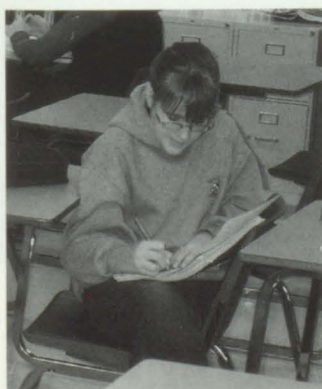
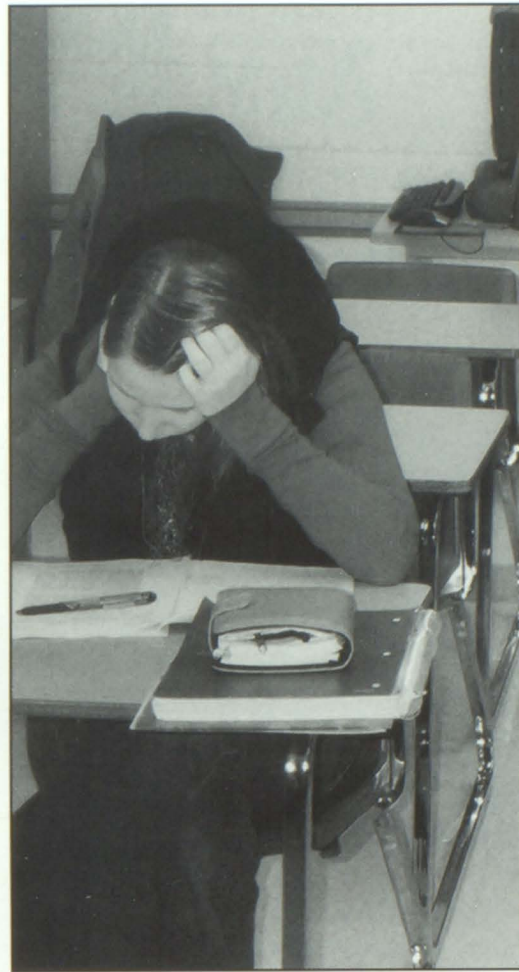

ALMOST FAMOUS

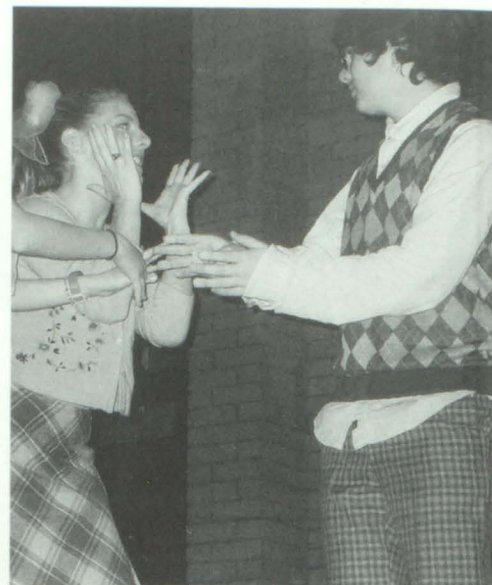
Music filled the auditorium this November at the fall musical. With a smaller very talented cast of high school musical students, "Little Shop of Horrors" was a hit.

individual projects, then coming back to that large group to share their knowledge with their peers and show them their newly gained leadership skills.

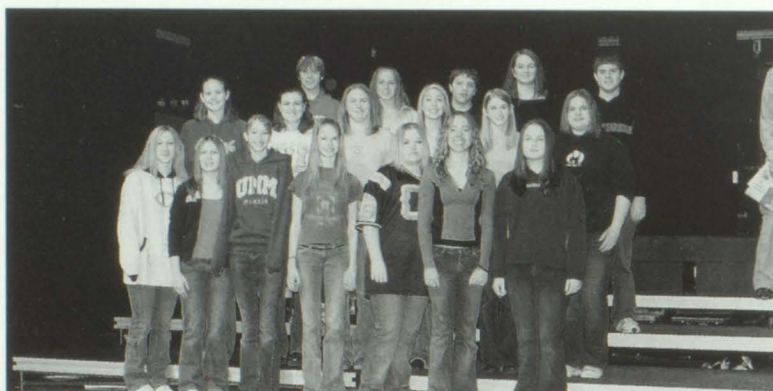
By the end of the year, many members participated in state

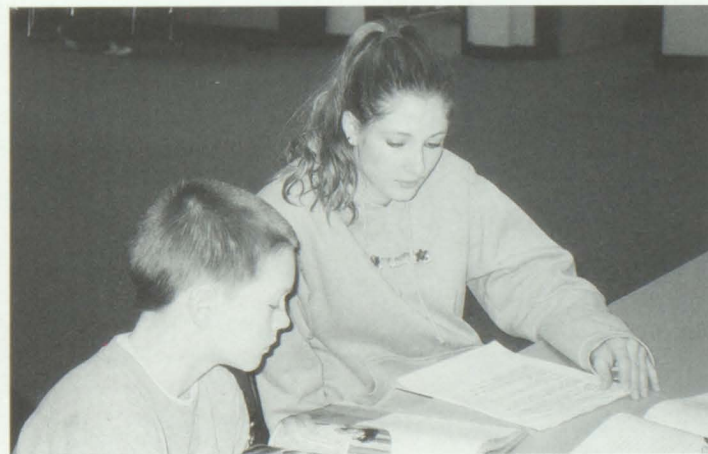
America Reads, a tutoring program created by former president Bill Clinton, had another successful year at Waconia

America Reads is an important program in helping younger students to be confident and independent readers.



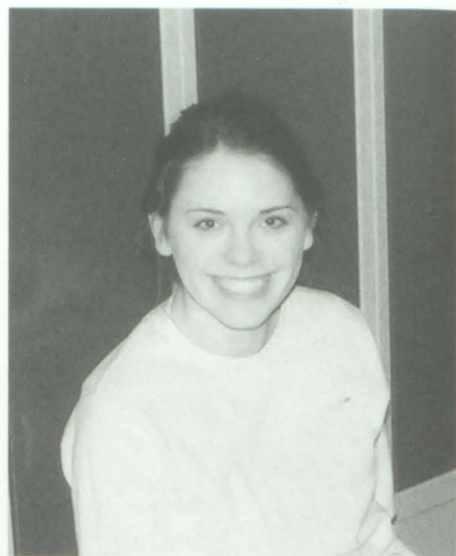

interesting happens everyday, and that band is more than playing instruments, it's just a way of life for many WHS students.



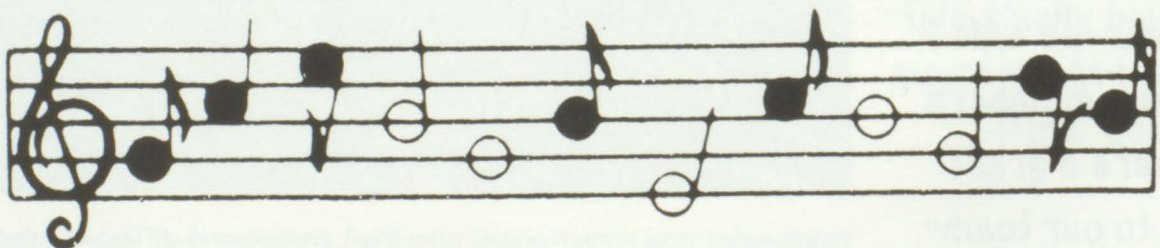

ALL THAT JAZZ



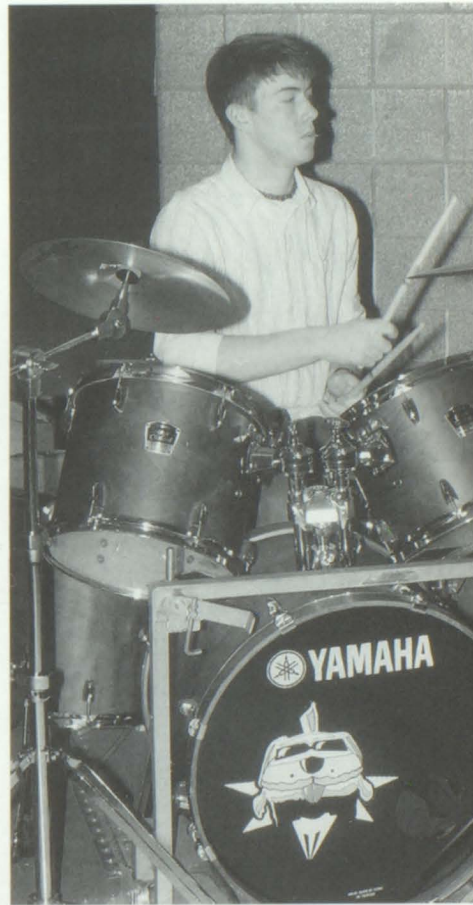
"Let's kick it!" said the Jazz One band during their Christmas performance.

It was a fun year for the choirs at WHS. All three choirs did an awesome job at learning and performing their music, and will definitely have more fun years to come.

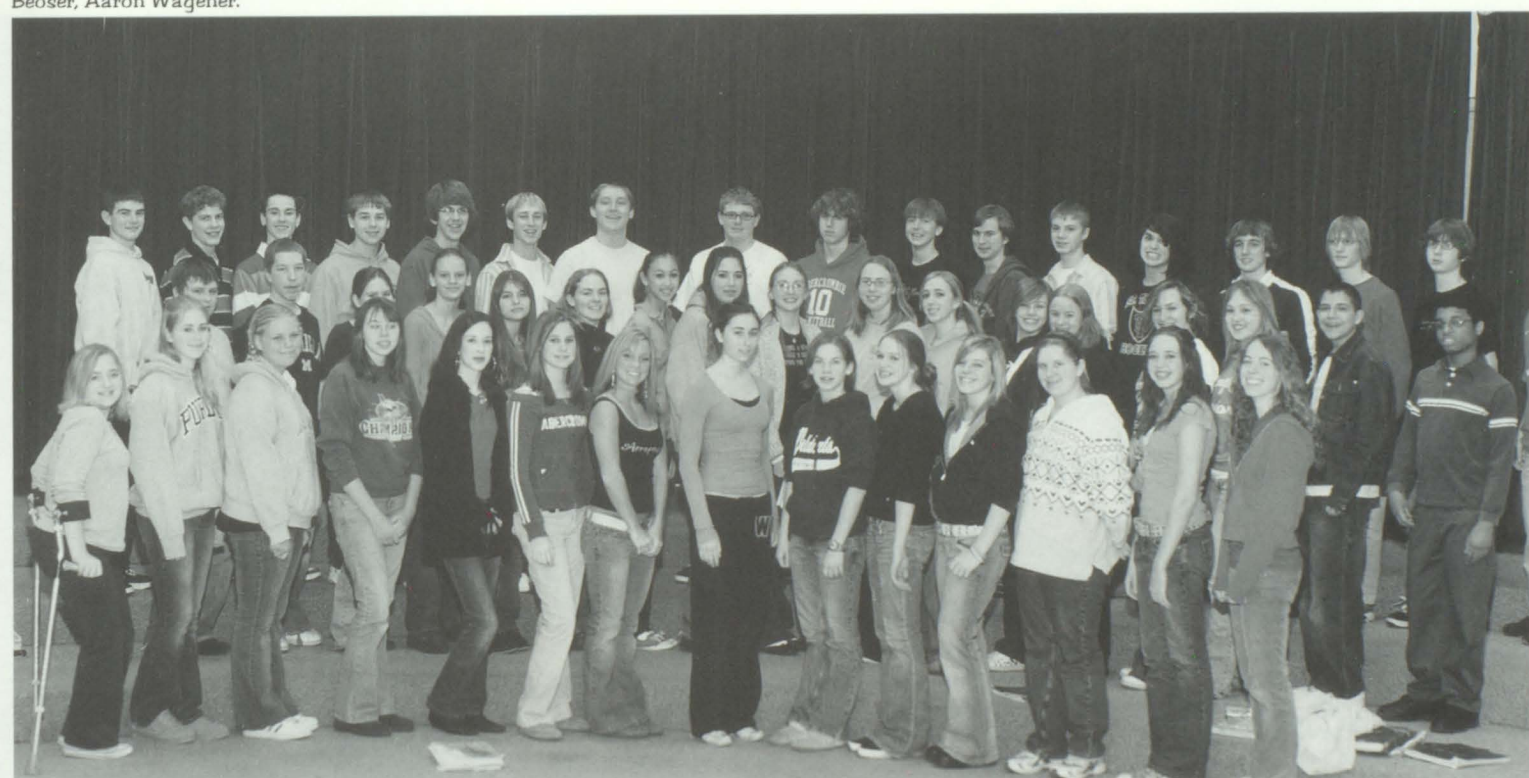

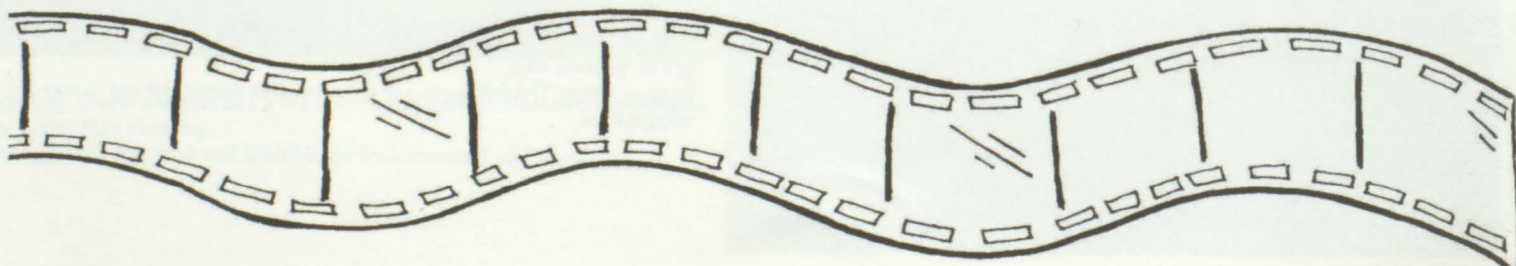

The season ended with an outstanding record total of 20-9. Jenny Van Kirk described the season as, "The best season ever!

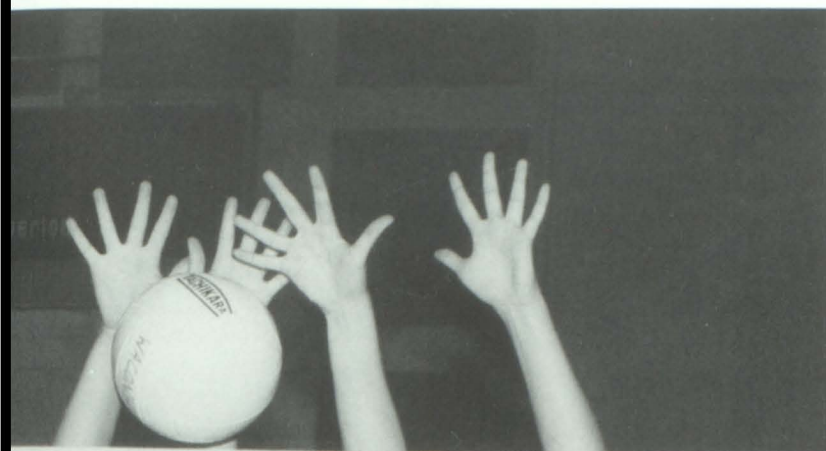

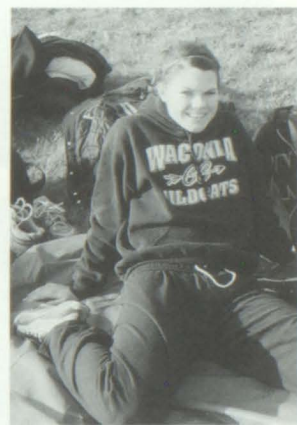
CATCH ME IF YOU CAN

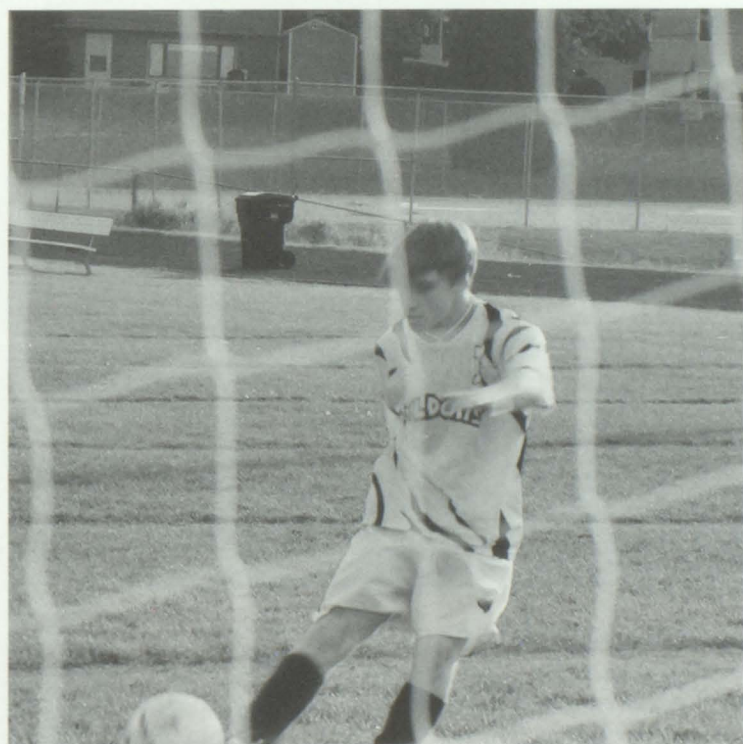

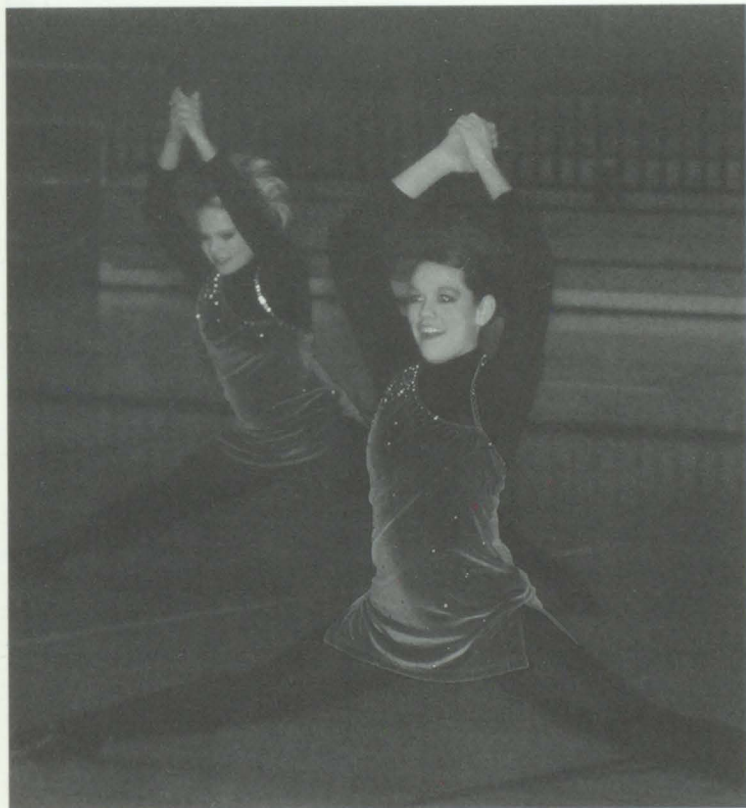

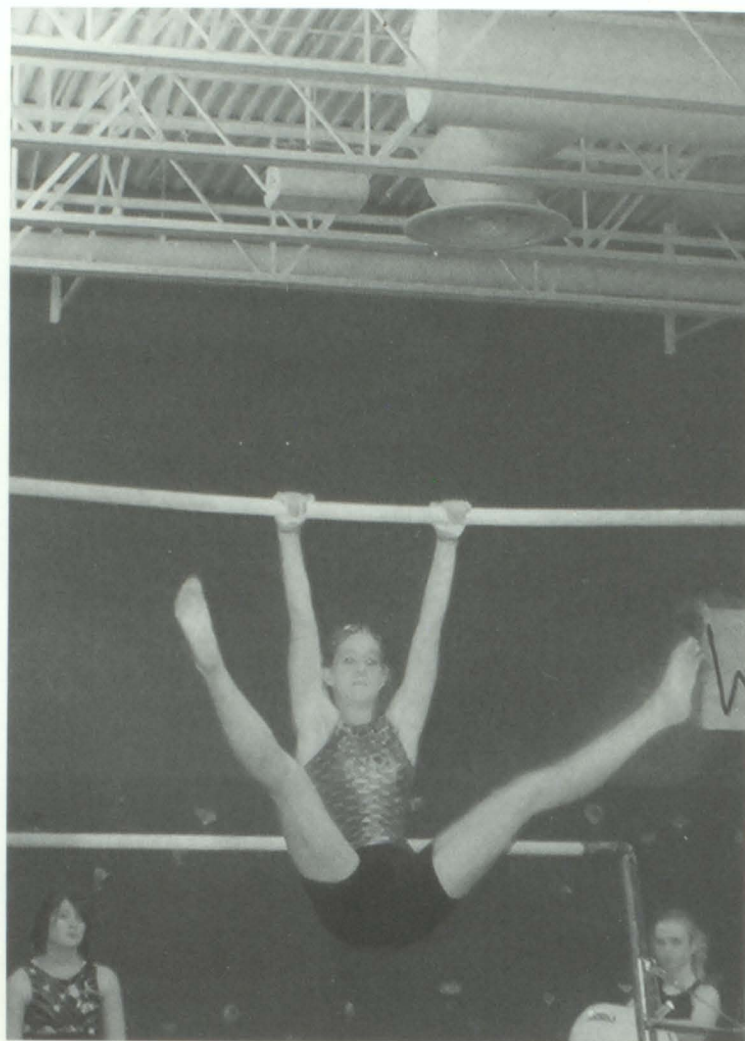

During the meet against Becker, Waconia beat the school record by scoring a 126.55. This beat the old school record by over three points. This was the second

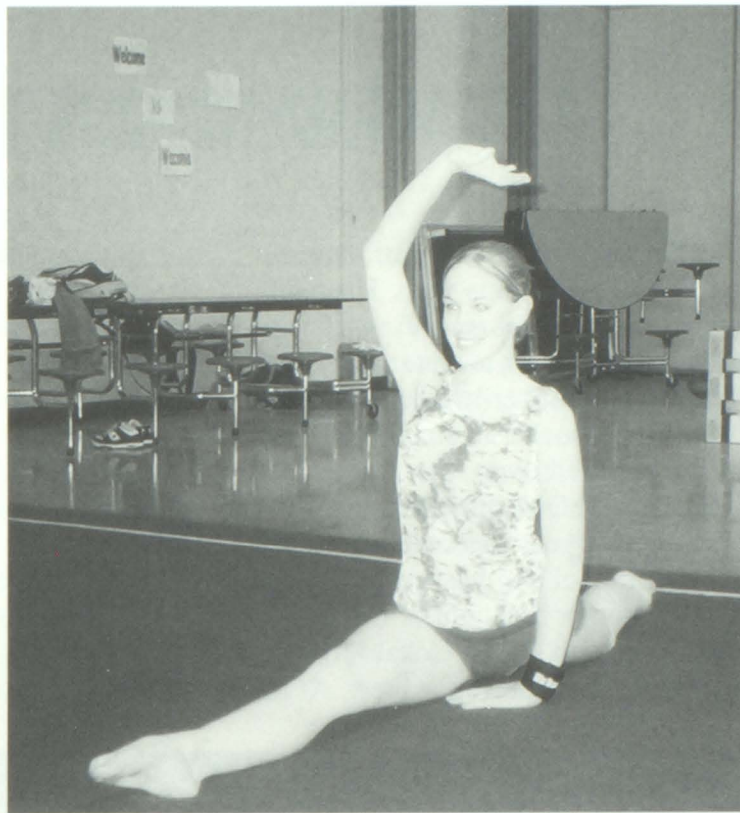
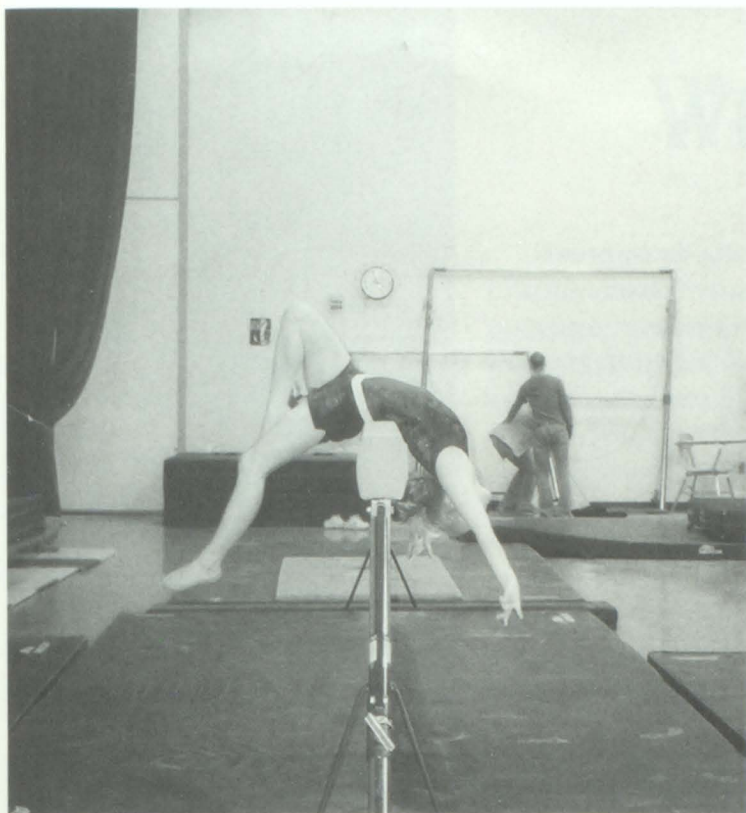
time that the WHS gymnasts have beaten the school record this year.

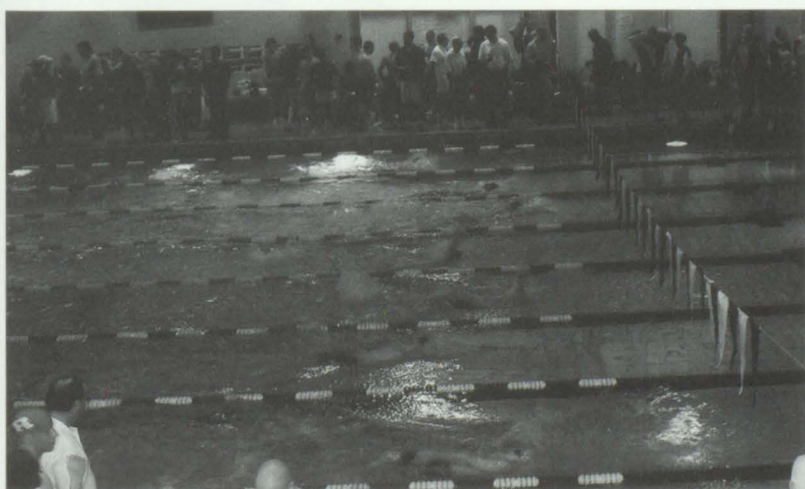
WITHOUT LIMITS

Due to the high goals the team set

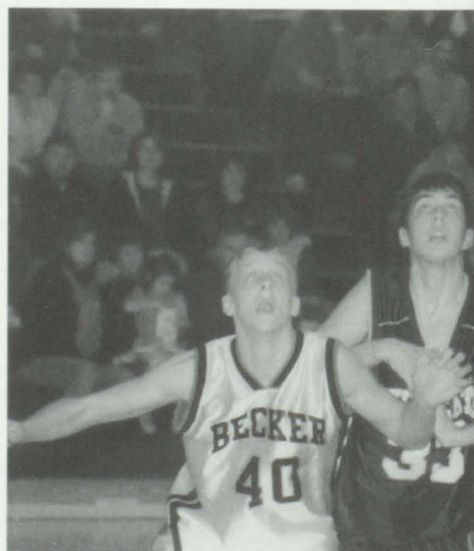
and the determination to reach them, the Waconia Wildcats took first in the Wright County Conference.

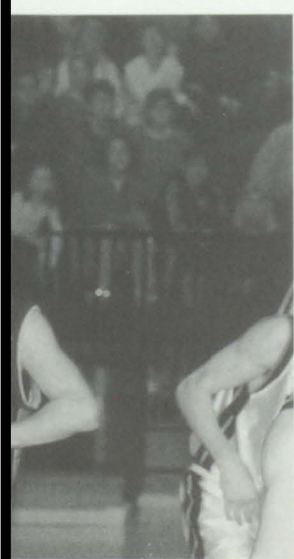

FIGHT CLUB

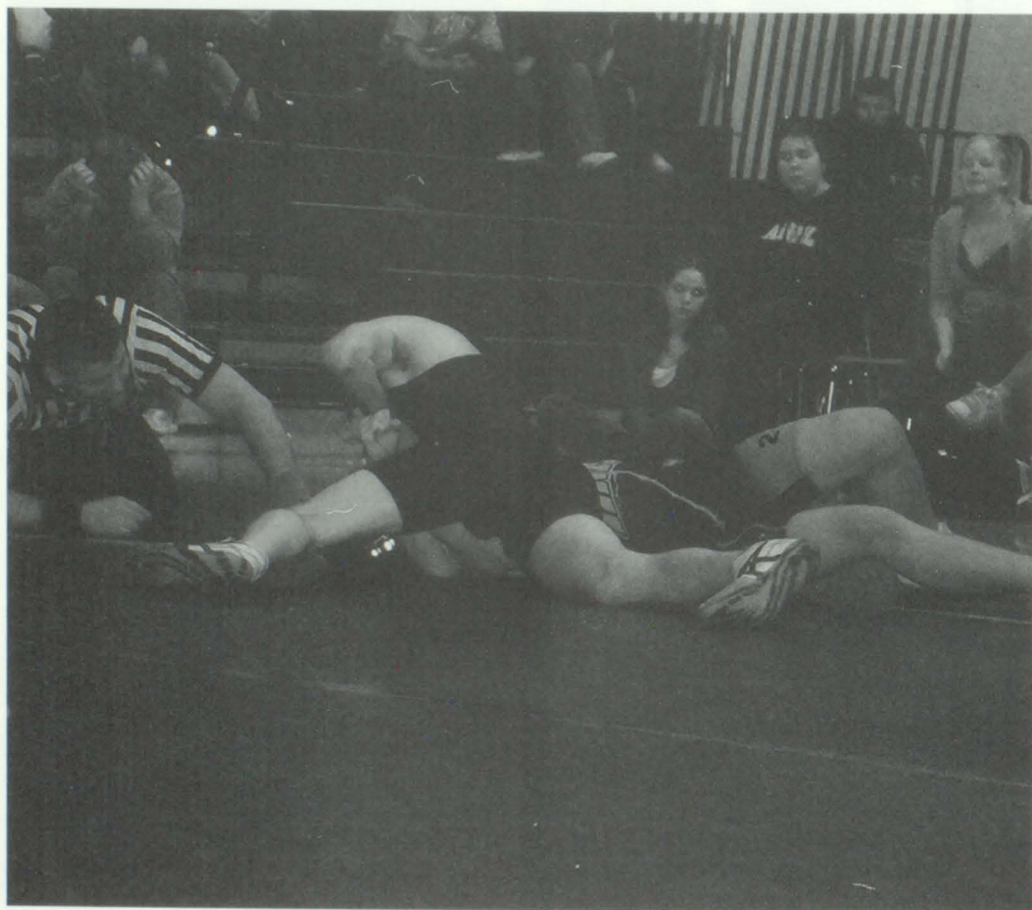

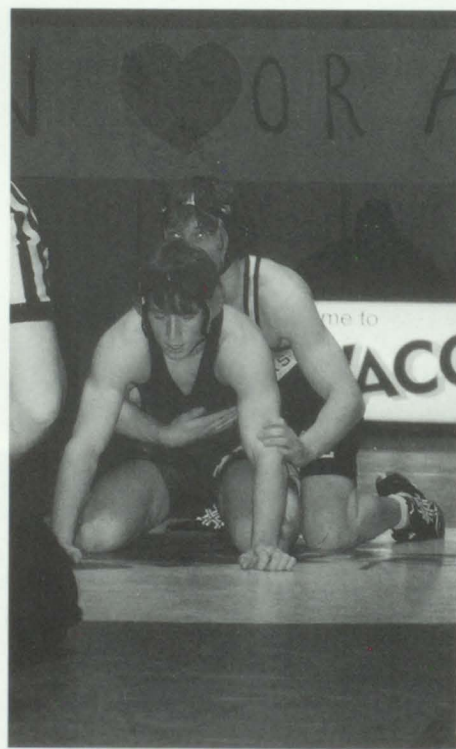
"It was an experience I'll remember my entire life," says Nord about taking first.

Overall, Coach Wagener feels it was a year of many accomplished goals.

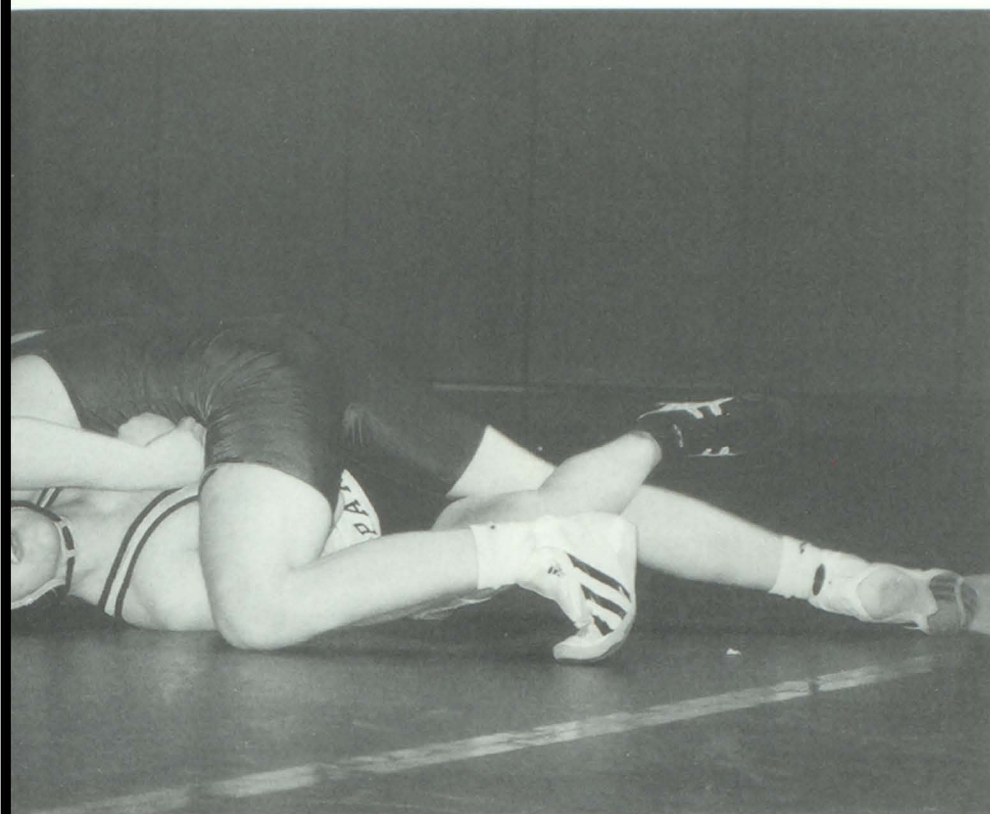

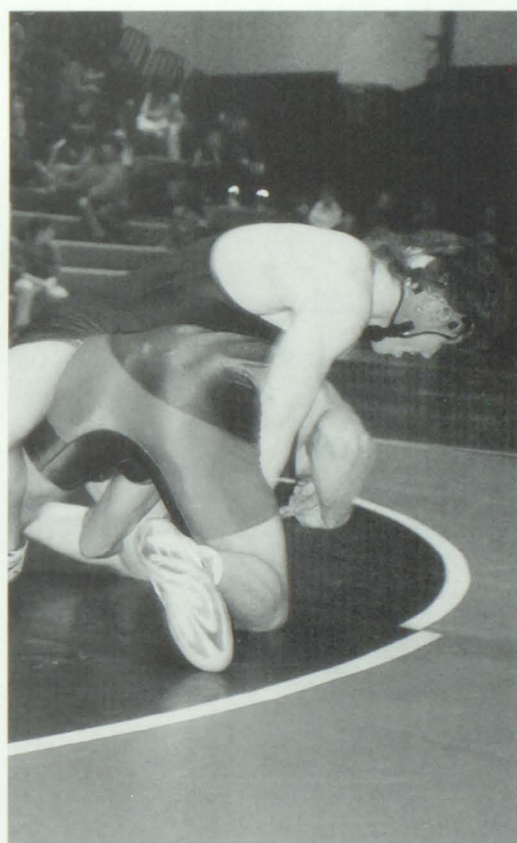
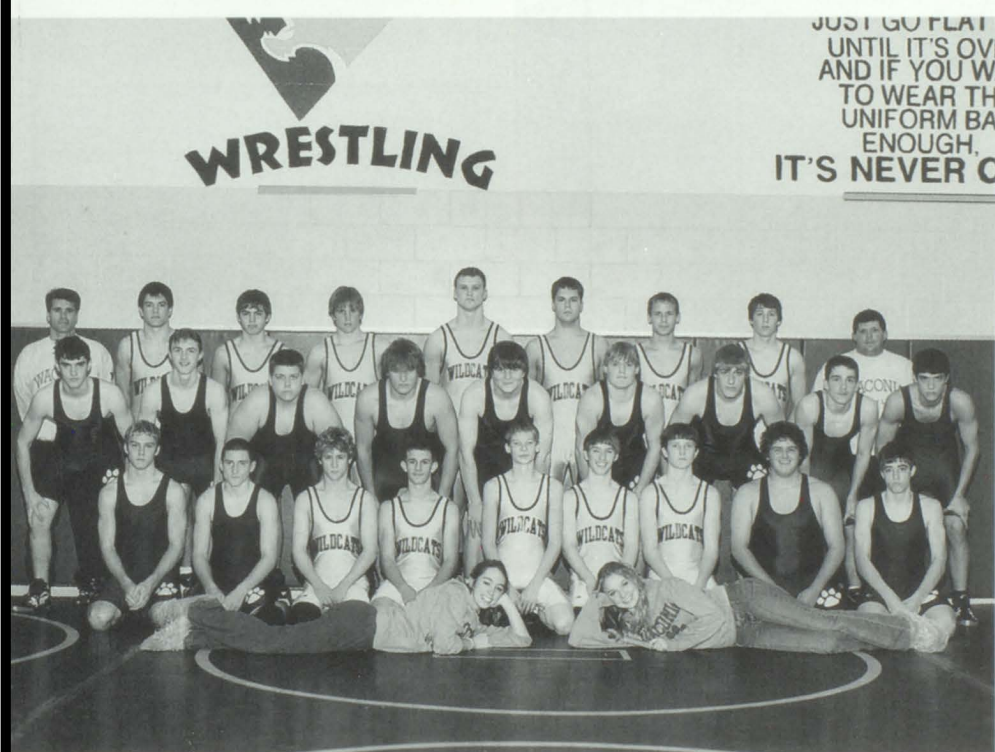

Though the team has improved greatly this year they hope they can achieve more goals in years to come.



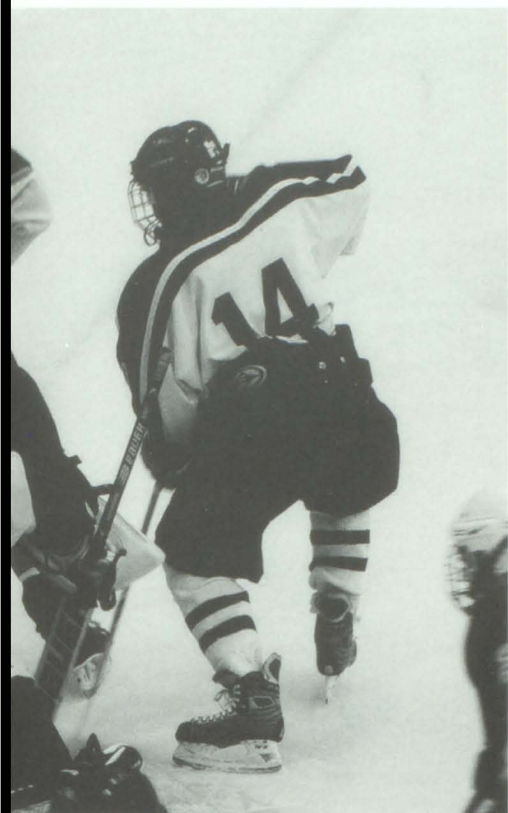

looks, strategy, and tactics. We will be unstoppable. It's too good to be true, I know" says Senior Cal Zupan, who has already started making his team.

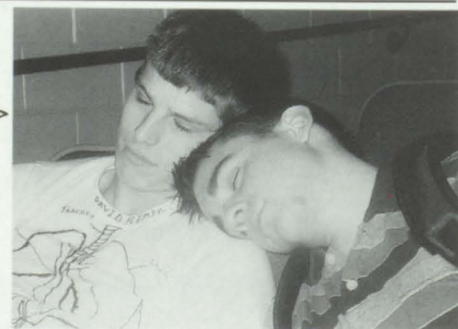

Additions will have to be added to the school and the parking lot sometime down the line.

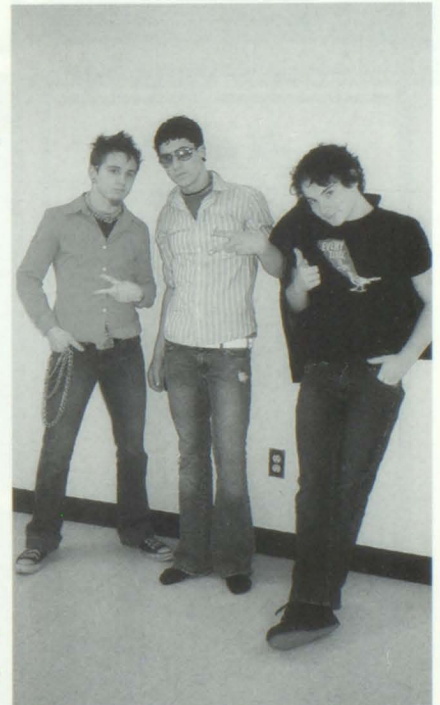
So a word to underclassmen: be prepared to walk the long distance to your car if you are not one of the lucky few that get front row parking.

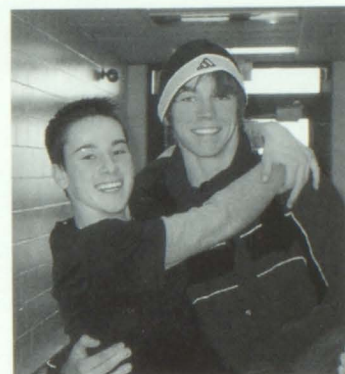
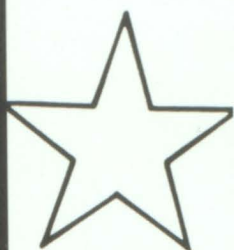
With the loss of past advisory, Heidi Degener, the yearbook was not as stable as it has been in past years.

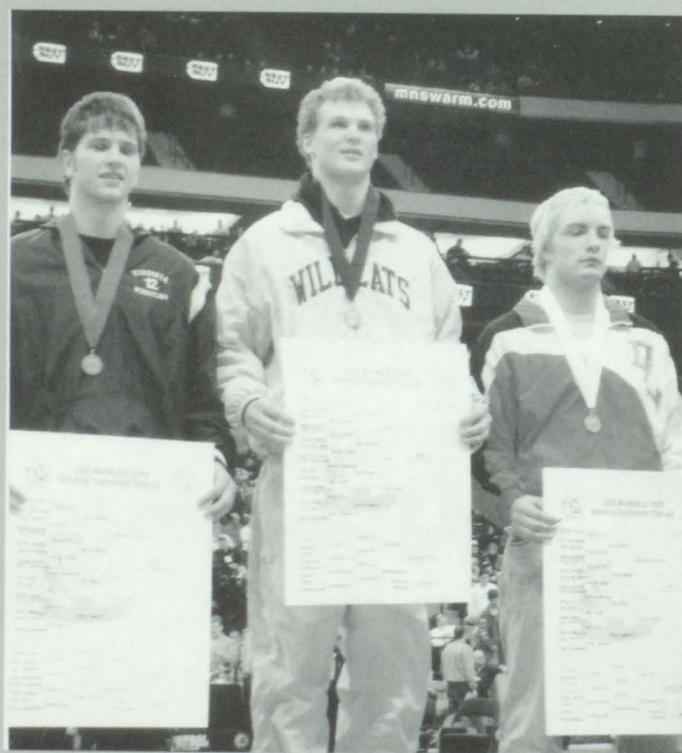

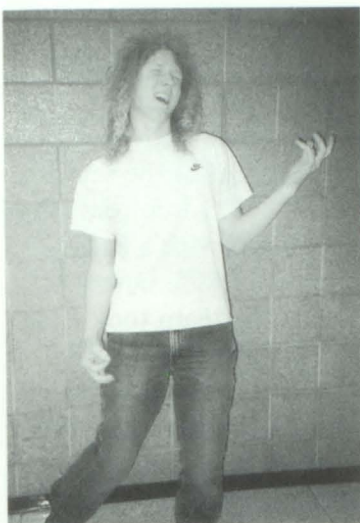

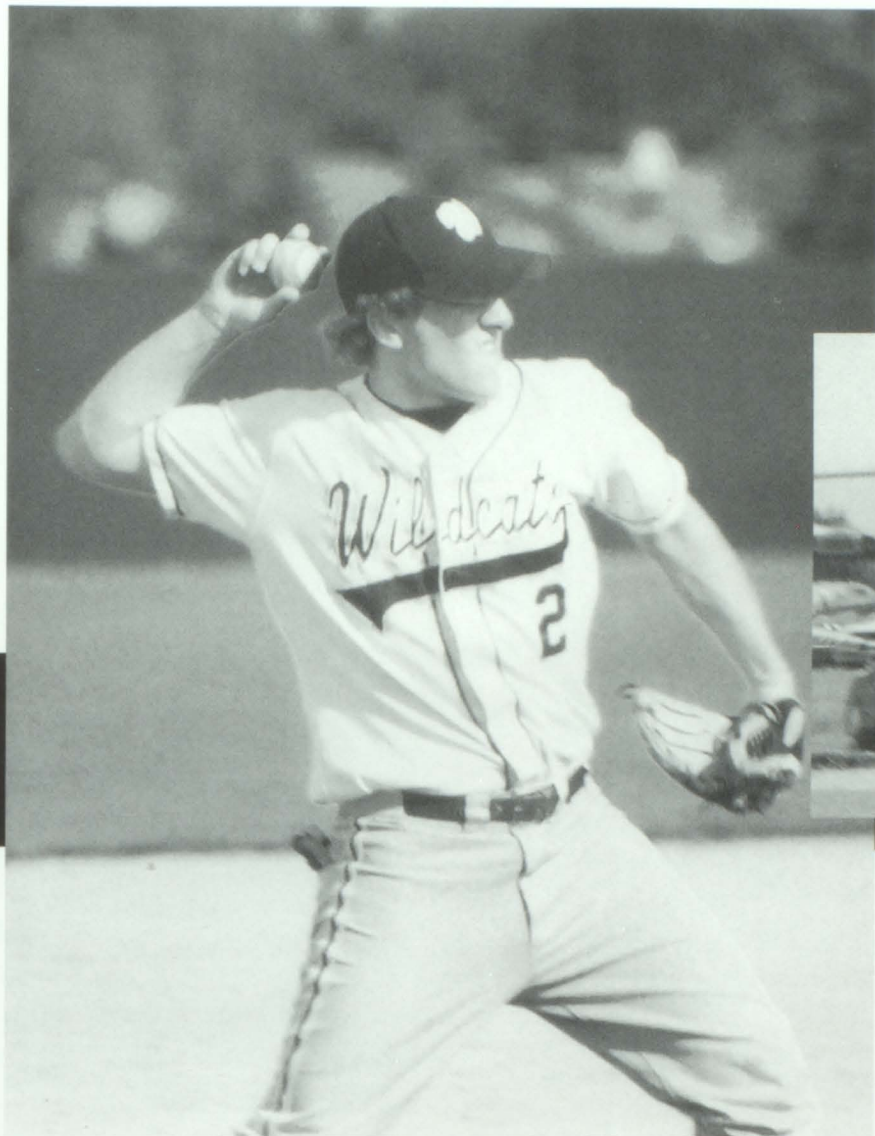

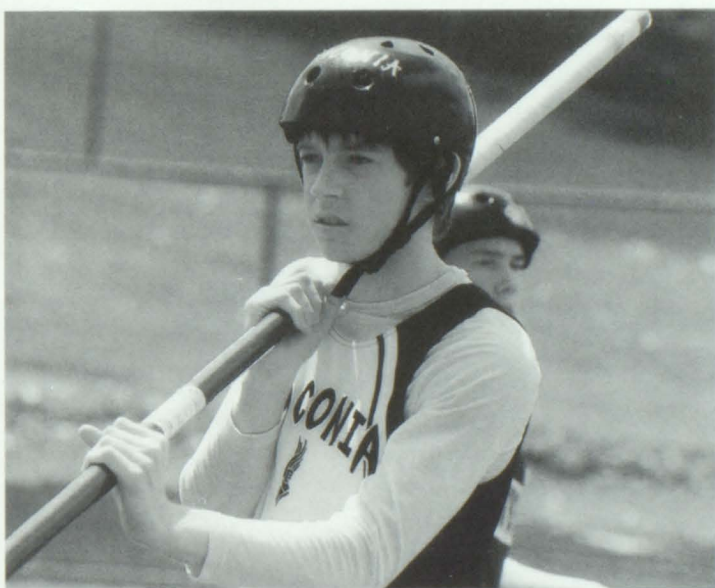
