Every year, FCCLA members complete one in-depth project. This year the group chose Operation Respect, a project that targeted various forms of bullying and hoped to identify forms of bullying before it became a problem.
The project required monthly interactions with students at the district elementary schools. Members worked with students in grades K-4, using Power Points and videos made by the fourth graders that depicted typical bullying behaviors. The members also presented skits and ended each session with a game to reinforce what was presented.
STAR events are another FCCLA tradition. This year a number of students presented at the local, regional and state level on topics ranging from child development to seat belt safety to collecting and distributing soap for people in Haiti.
