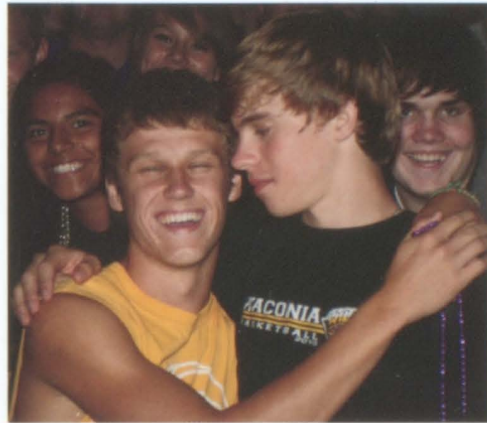

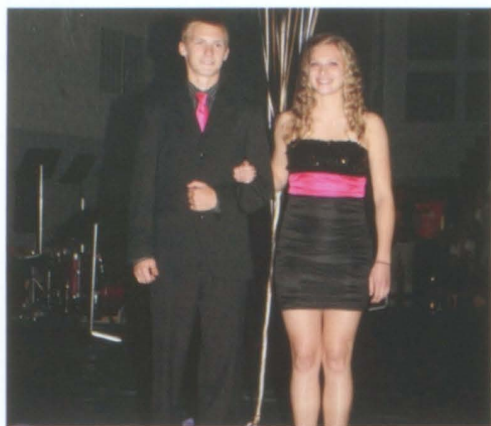

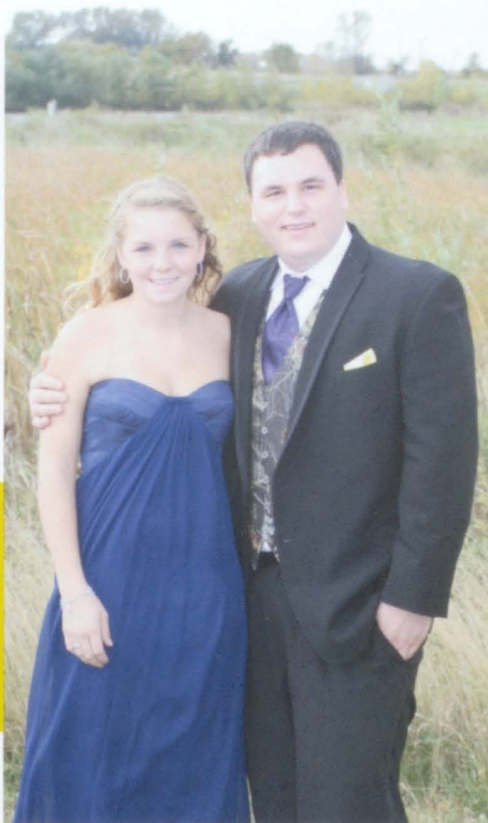

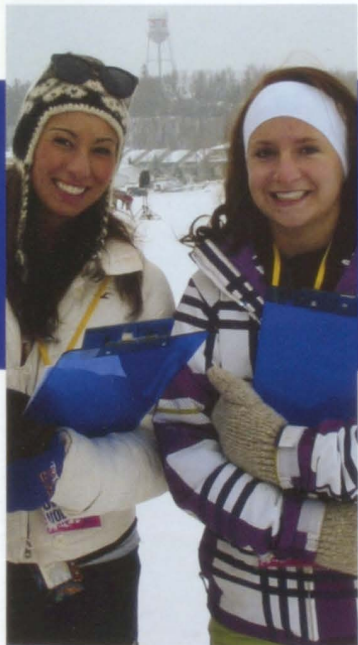

Every year, FCCLA members complete one in-depth project. This year the group chose Operation Respect, a project that targeted various forms of bullying and hoped to identify forms of bullying before it became a problem.

The project required monthly interactions with students at the district elementary schools. Henn said she enacted the changes because she really wanted members who are good role models and who live by the principles that SADD represents.

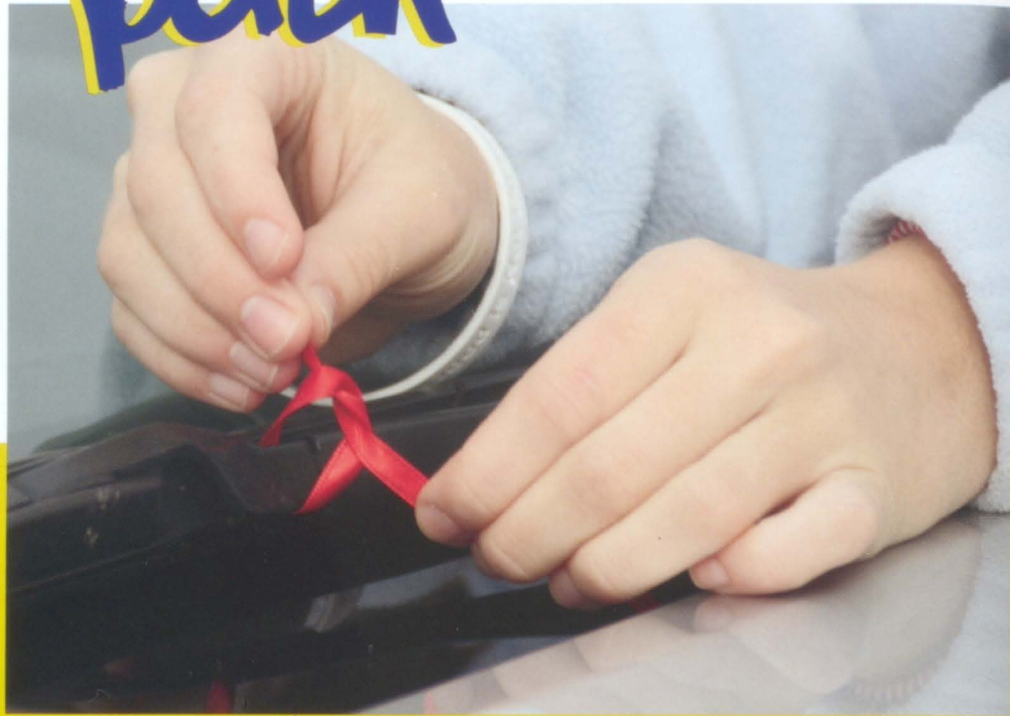
"This year's SADD group is the best I have ever had," said Henn. "They are all great students, positive role model and they are dedicated to what SADD represents."

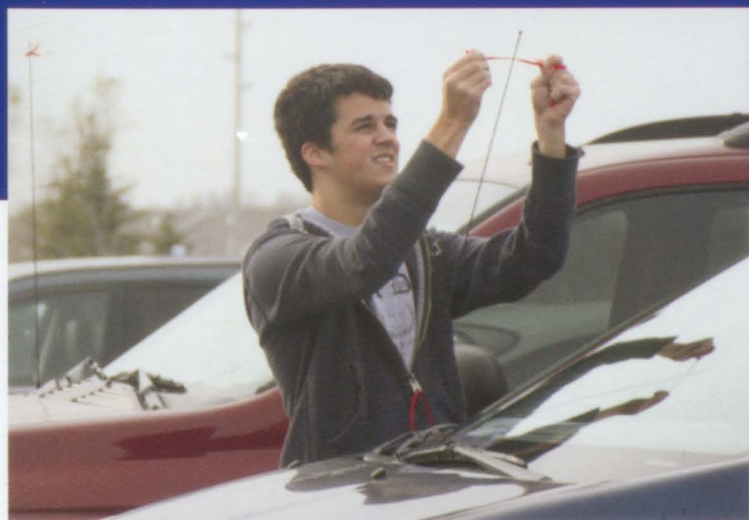

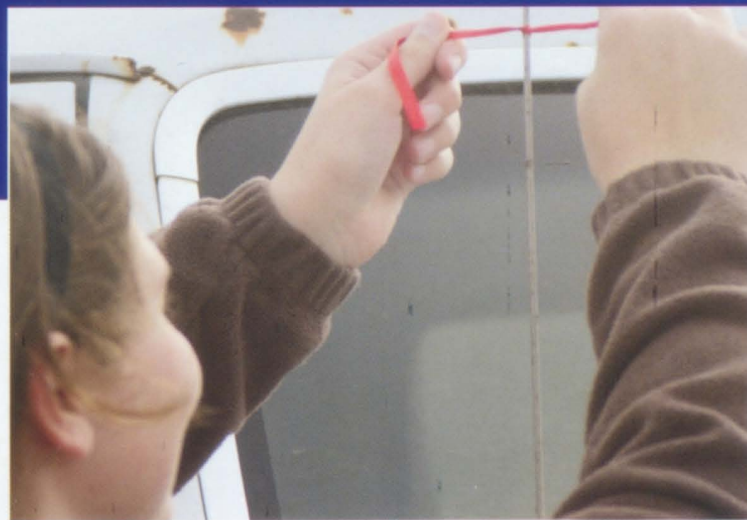

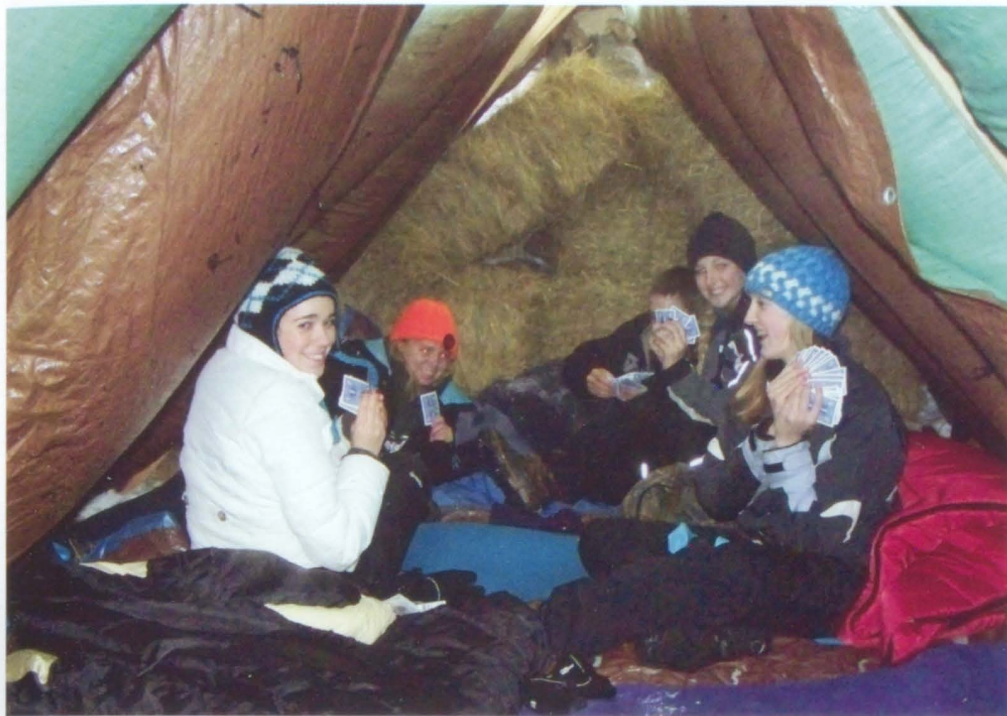

"Helping others really builds who you are and your character," said Willborg.

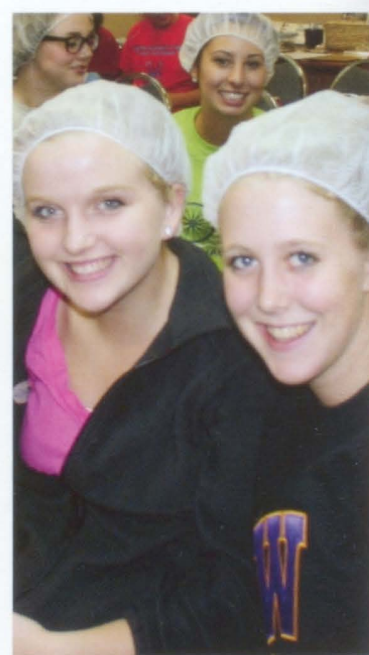
NHS is all about helping others but also achieving dreams and goals for the members and the future.

seeking the truth

In June 1977, an elderly woman was brutally murdered in a mansion that sits on the shores of chilly Lake Superior. Who was the prime suspect in this gruesome crime? The woman's daughter.

"The best competition would be our last trial. Larkin Scholla brought everyone together and gave us the best speech and morale boost. We were relaxed and ready to compete," said Ament.

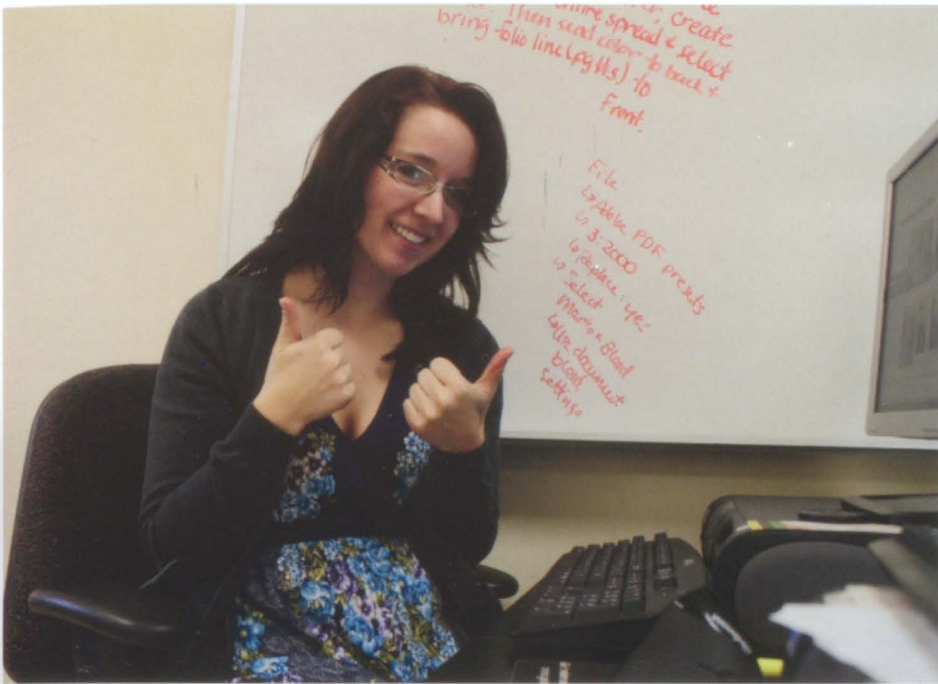

The process was time consuming and more difficult with a smaller group, but students were able to contribute more because of the small class. It was also an enjoyable time.

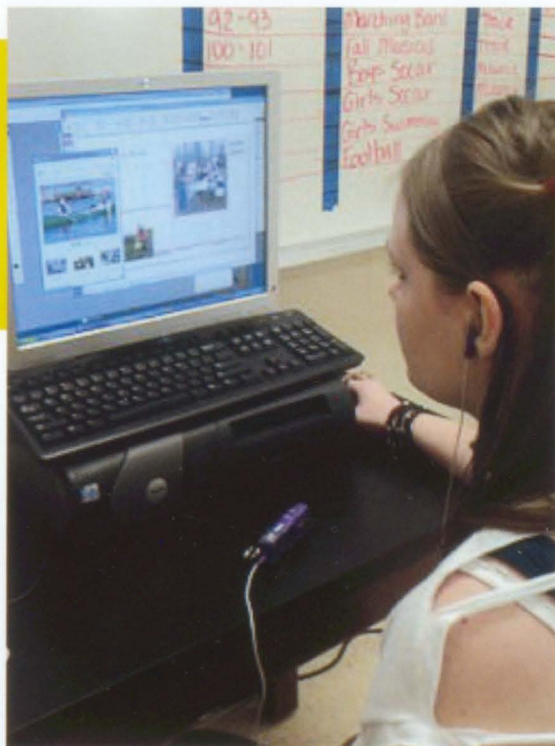

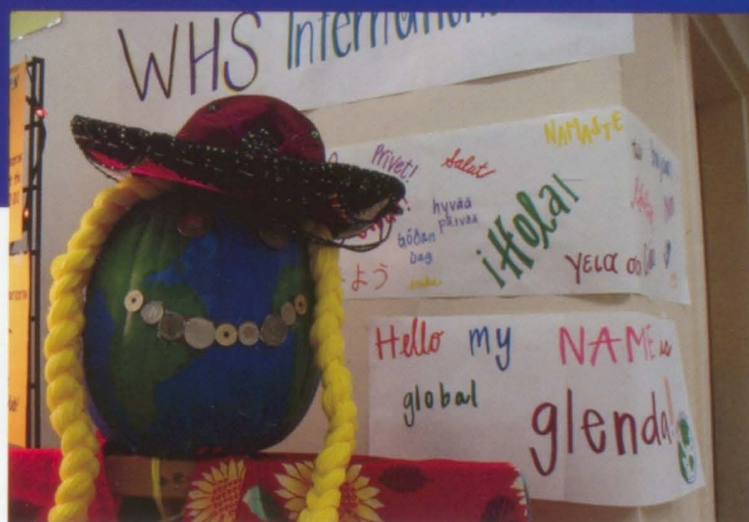

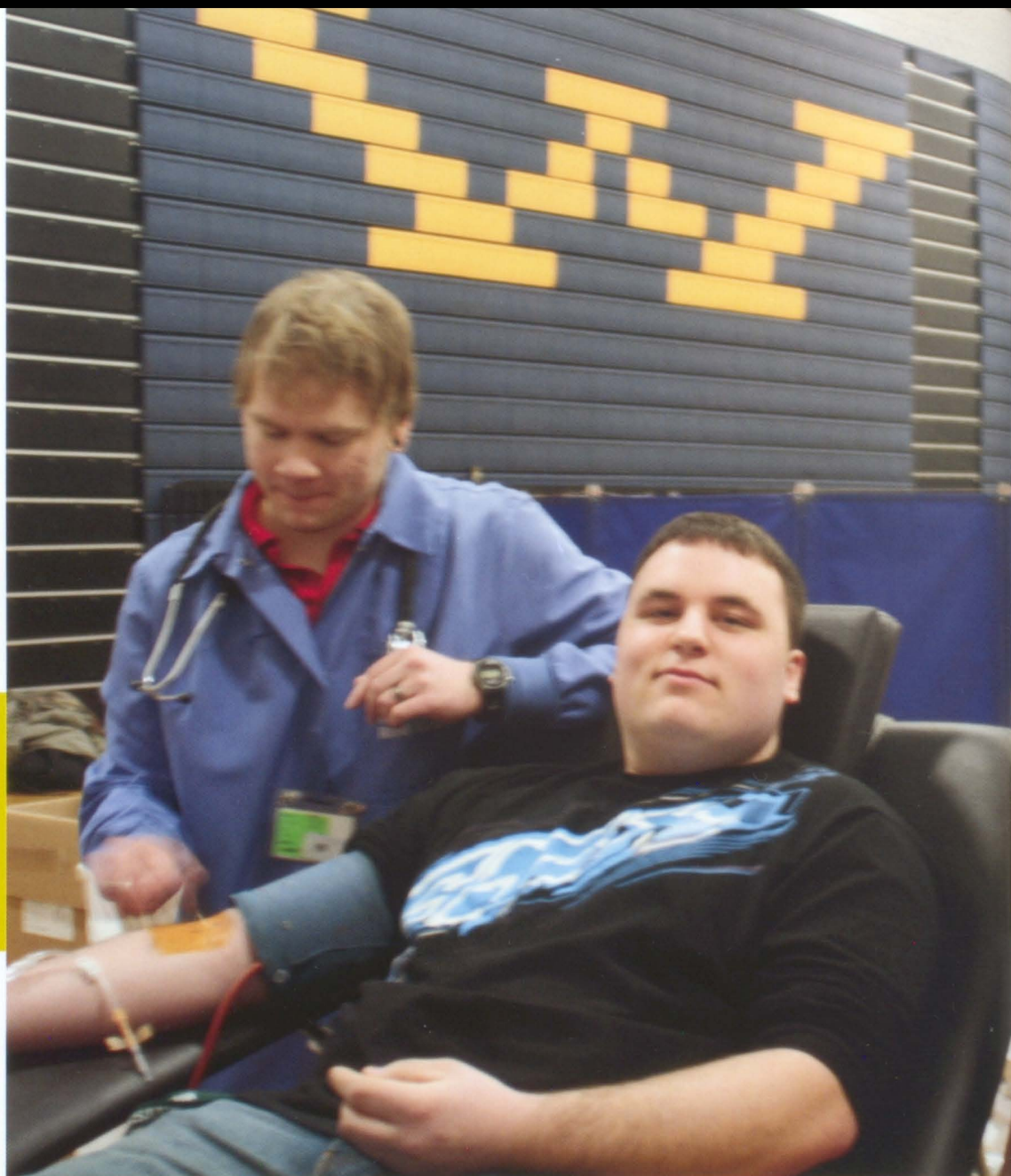
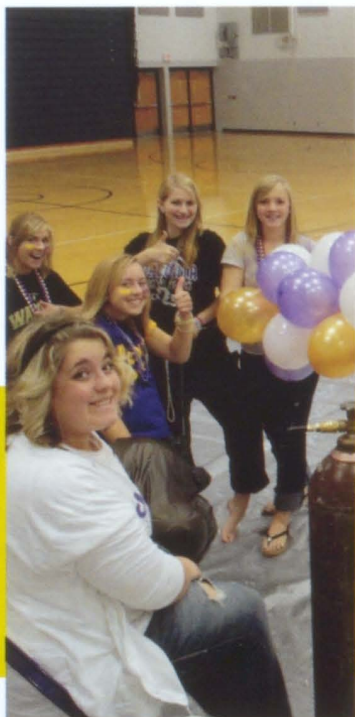

Doing things for others always make people feel good.

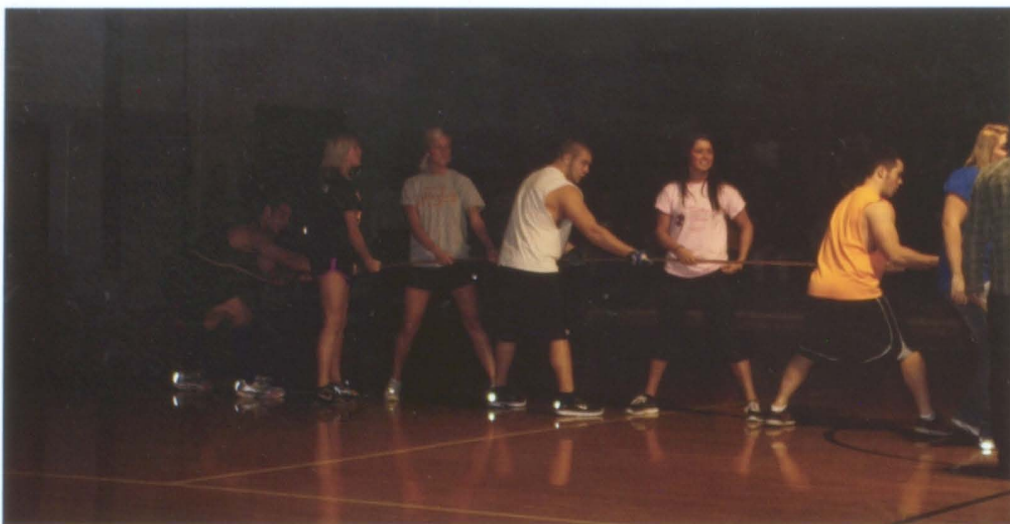
"It was a great way to help kid's holidays be a little brighter and filled with joy," said senior Abigale Christenson.

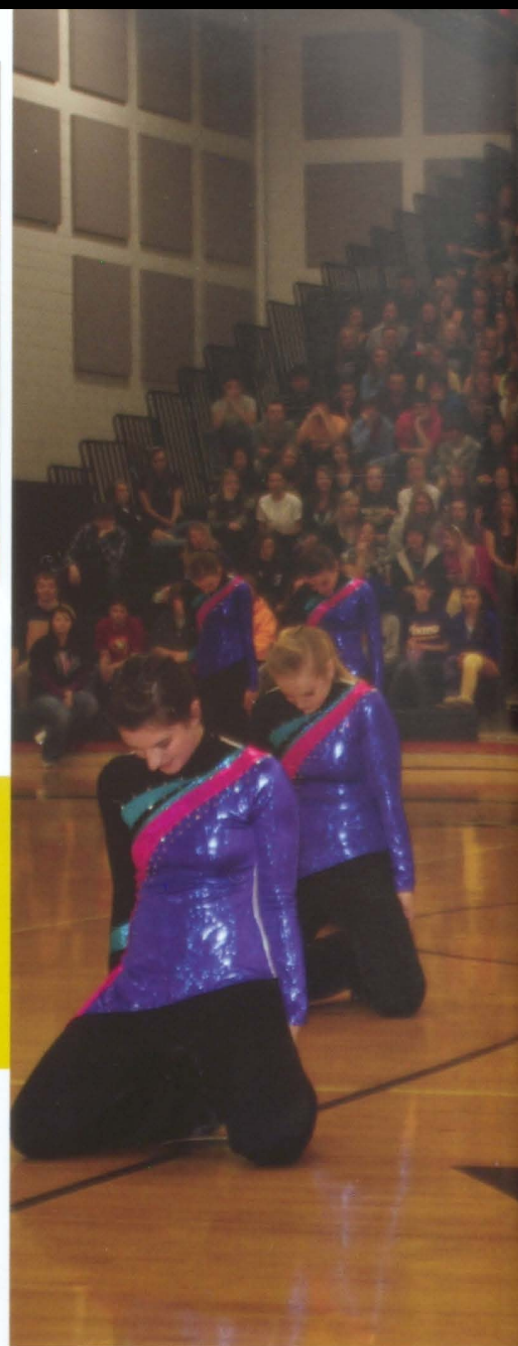

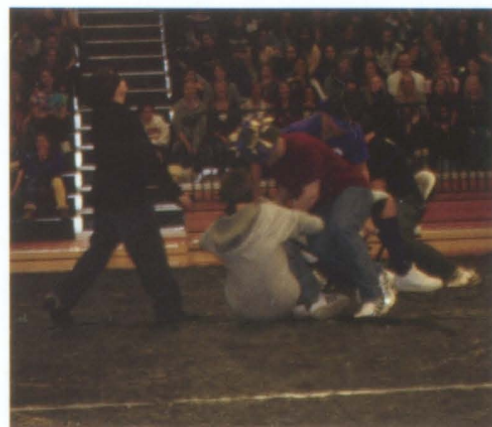

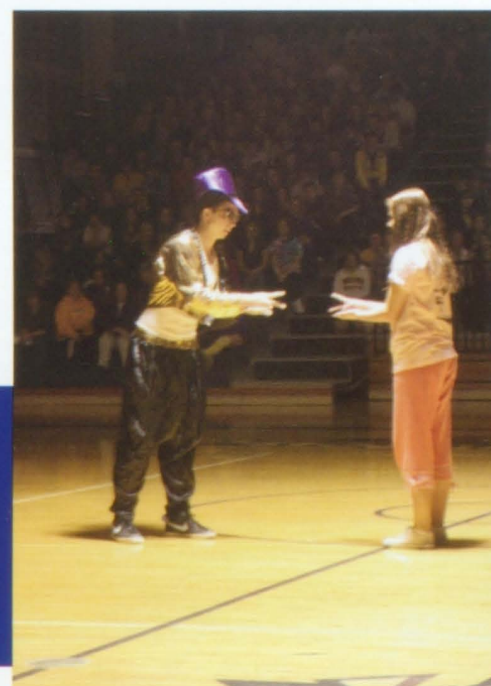

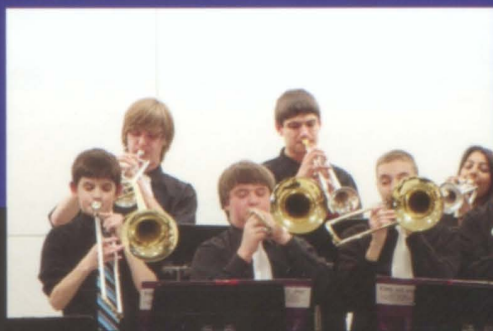

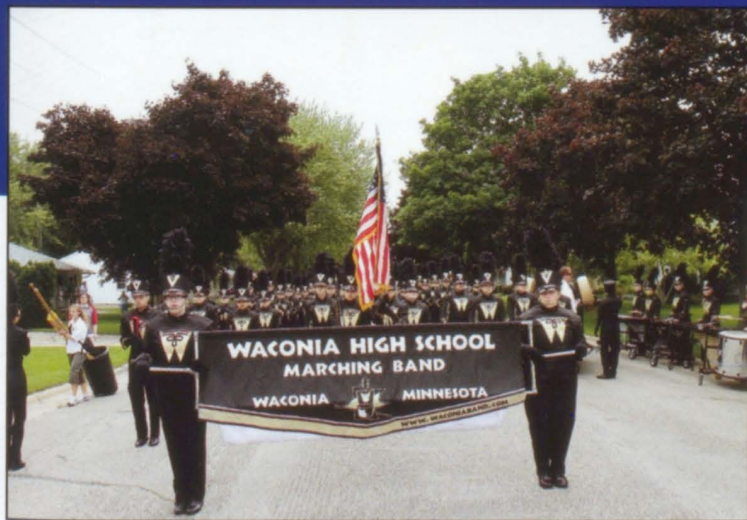

According to choir director Aaron Olson, the hardest part of the performance isn't singing for forty-five minutes, it's "maintaining focus and singing the high notes."

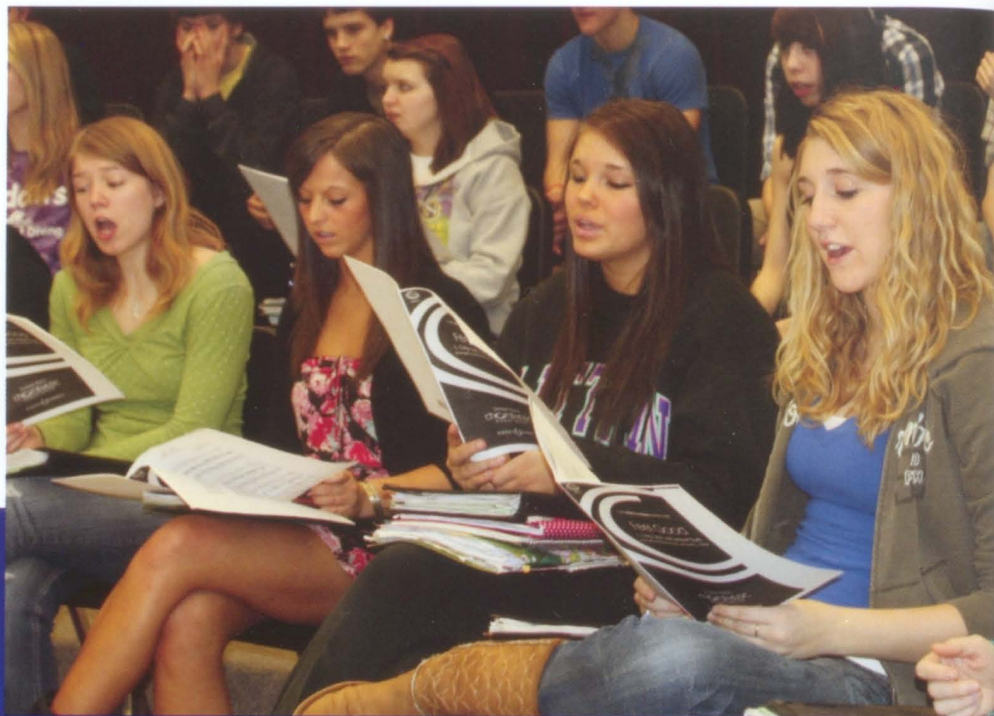
Olson said performing with an orchestra is "like nothing you'll ever experience."

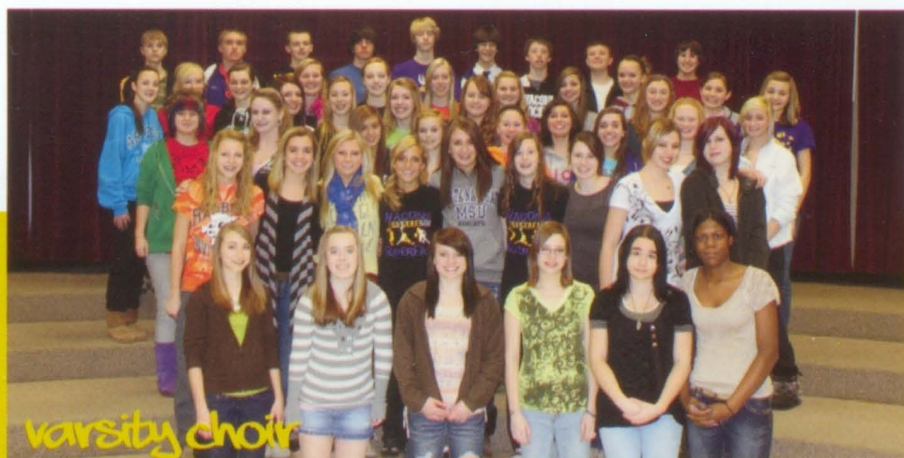

"I've been in one musical before this one, and I plan to be in some more," said junior Alexandra Buck.

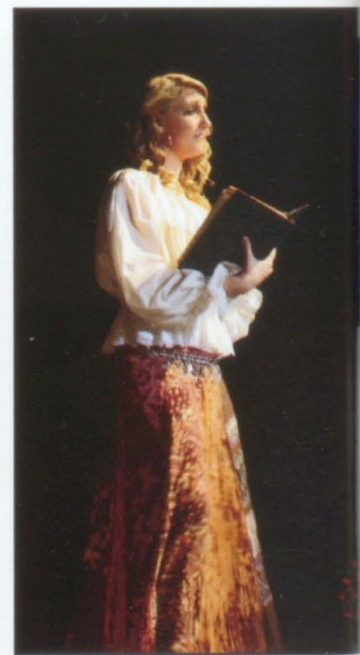

After every victory, the team would get together, face the crowd and yell the traditional C-A-T-S cheer.

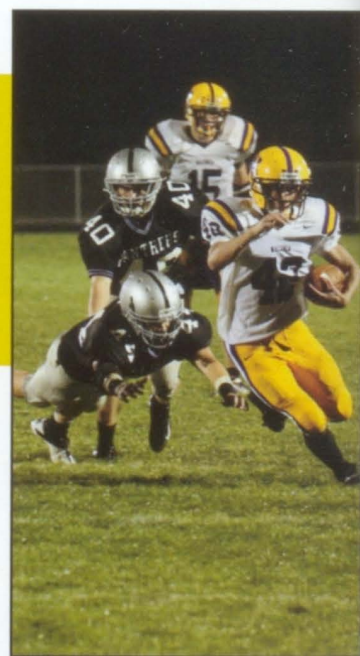

No matter what happens, the team will always have its memories of the 2010 season.

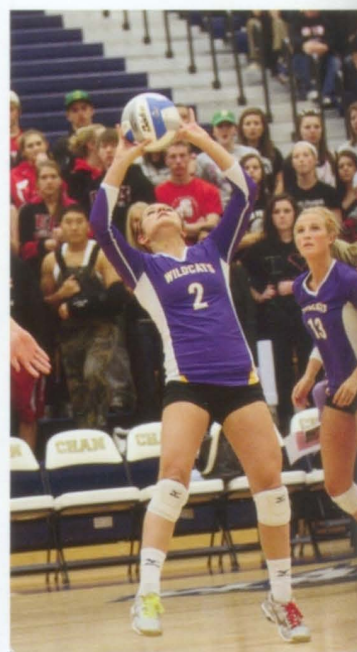

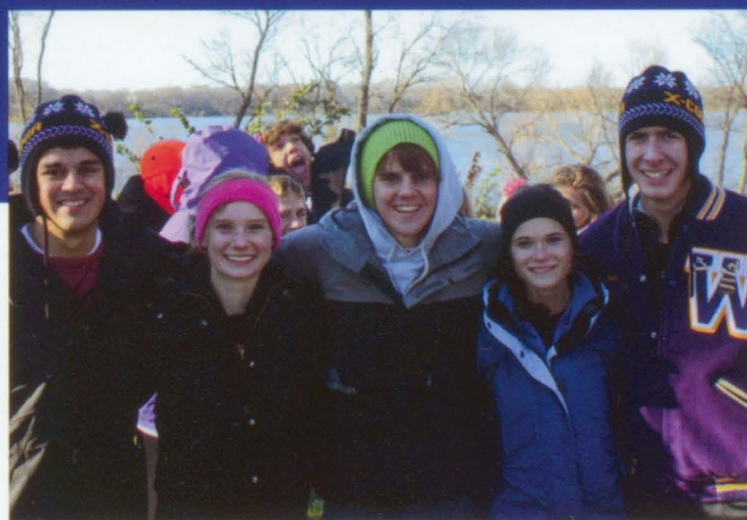

Still, playing with new teammates created a time for bonding and friendship, not to mention teambuilding.

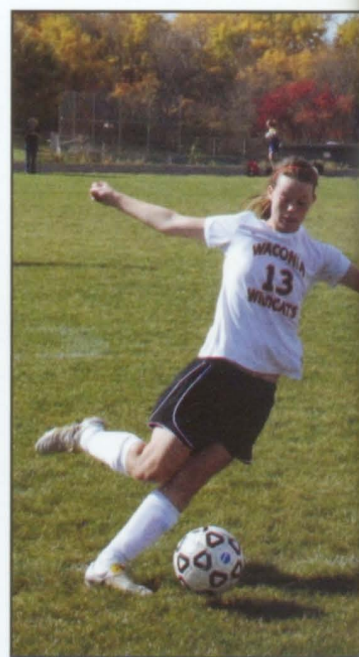

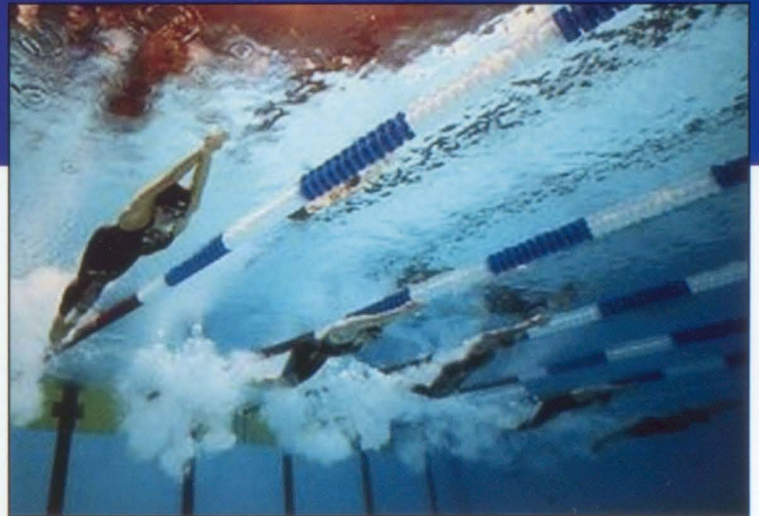

"The most memorable part of this season was all of the inside jokes and hilarious moments together," said captain Cassandra Johnson, a junior.

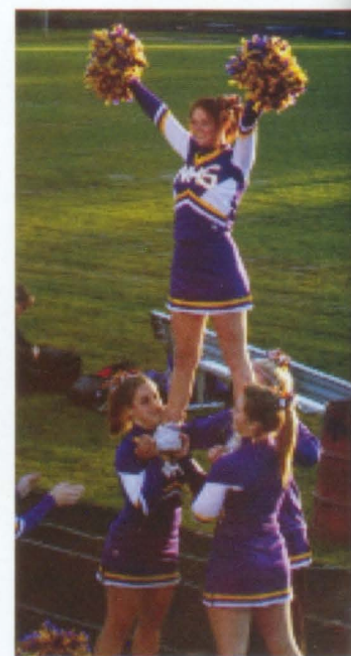
Overall this season was better than expected and the cheerleaders truly showed that they were proud to be Wildcats.

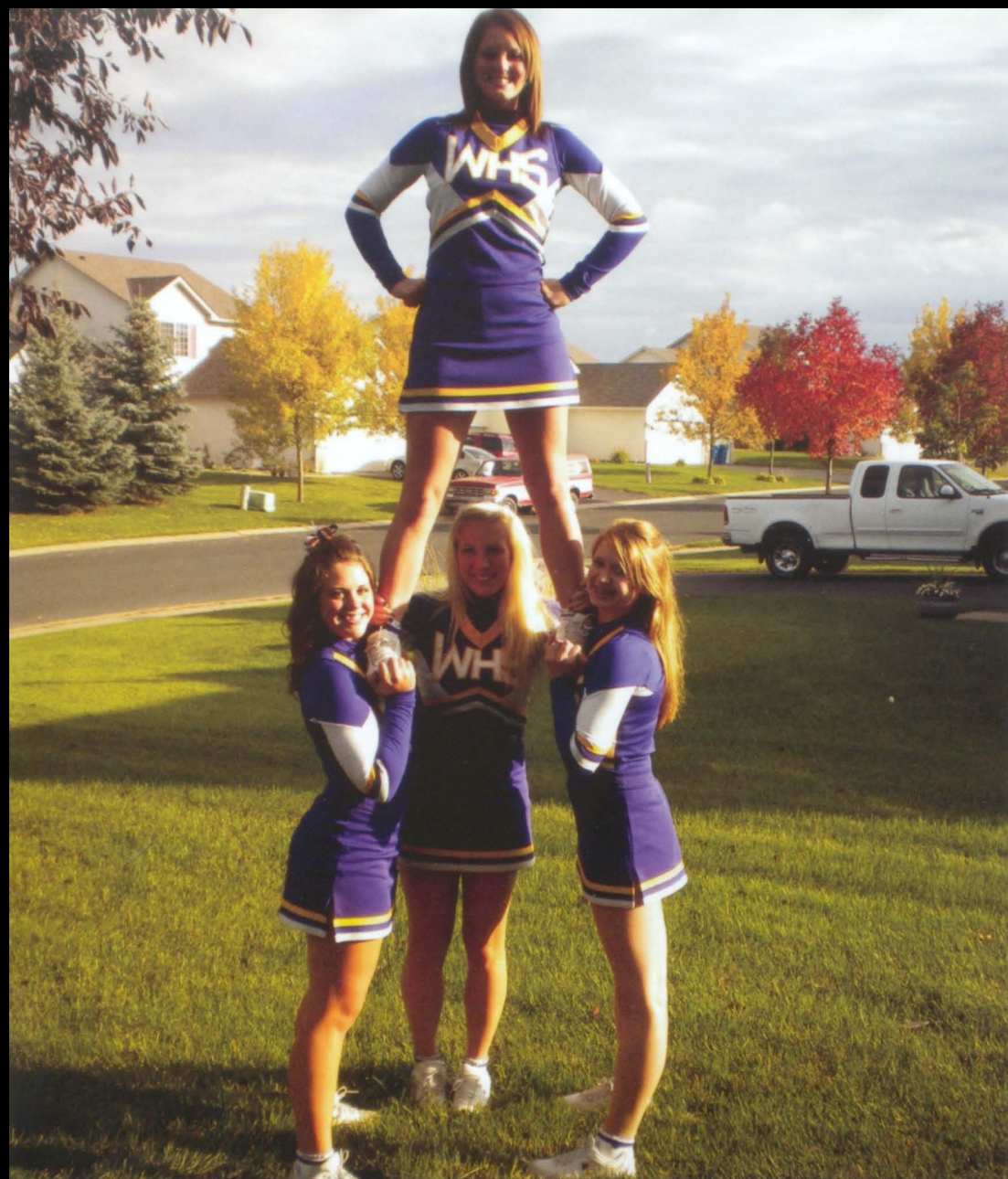

The boys fought their way to the top of the conference, to the section championship, and to the state tournament where they defeated Grand Rapids in the opening round setting up another game against Orono.

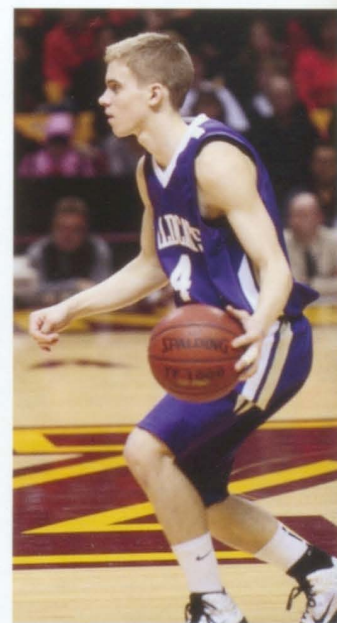
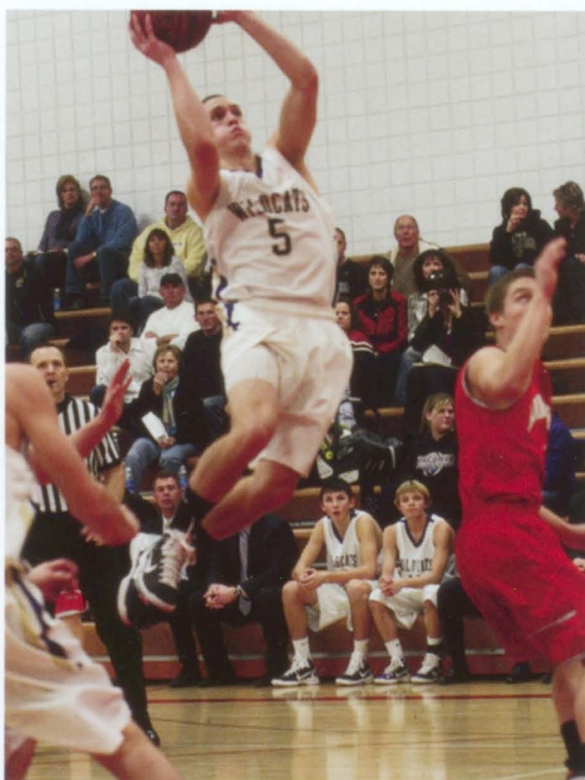

"The most difficult thing at state was when we lost, but we overcame it by coming out and winning our last game that got us third place," said Moats.

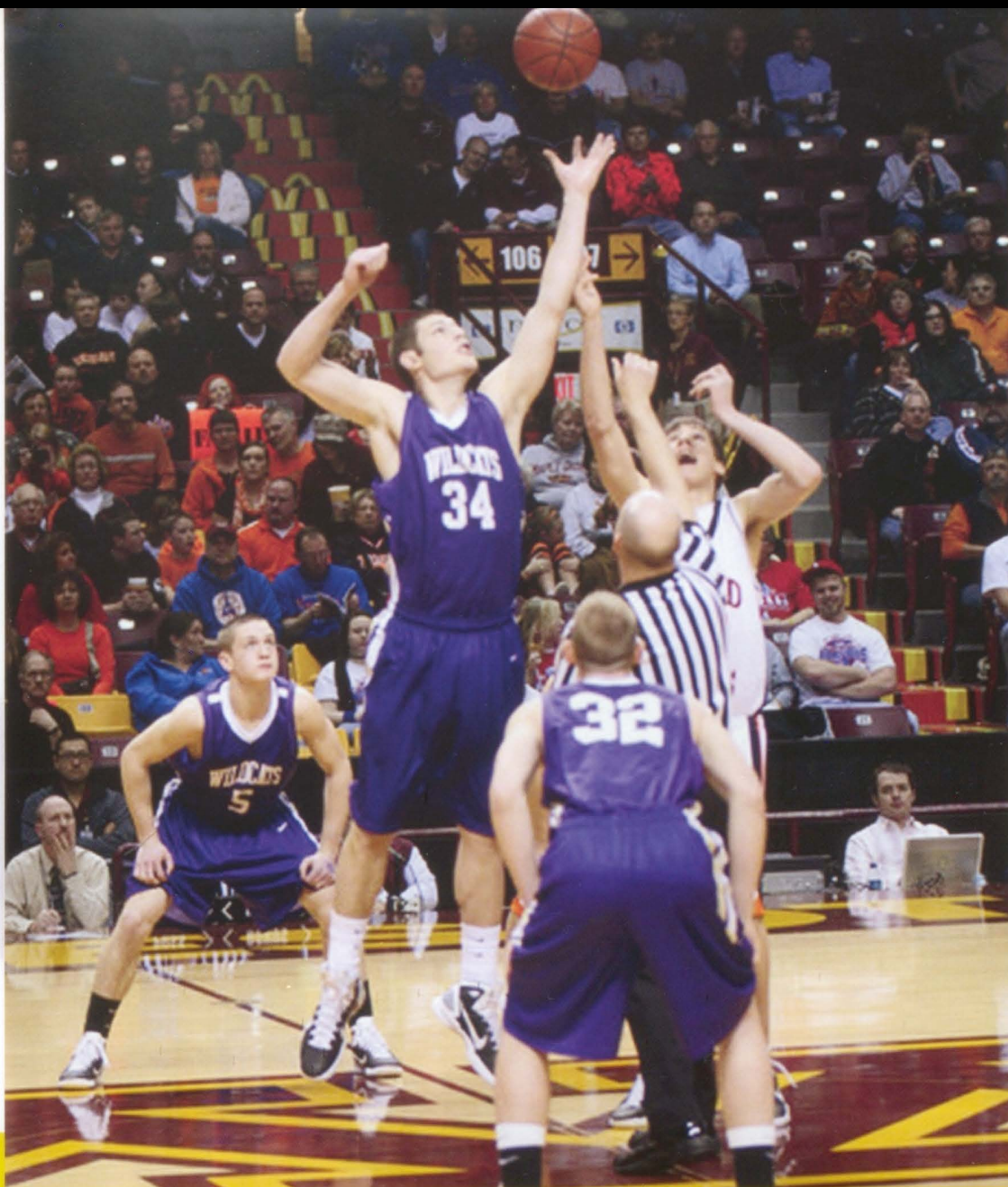

"I loved it when we'd pull out with a win in a close game. Everyone would get really into the game, and the fans would be going crazy," said Schnyder.

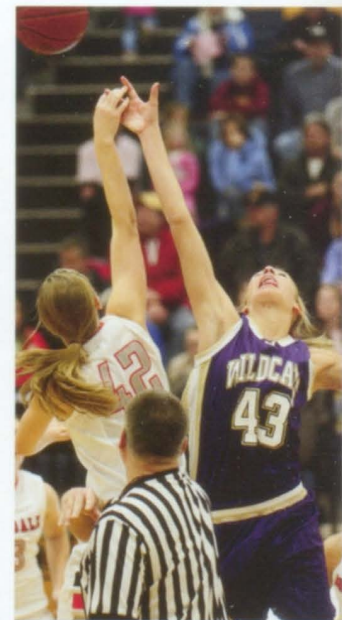
The loss of a number of seniors from the 2010 team meant that many girls were playing varsity with little experience. This left some girls wondering how the season would go.

"My favorite part of wrestling is the chemistry that the team has and that creates a family," said captain senior Will Lynn.

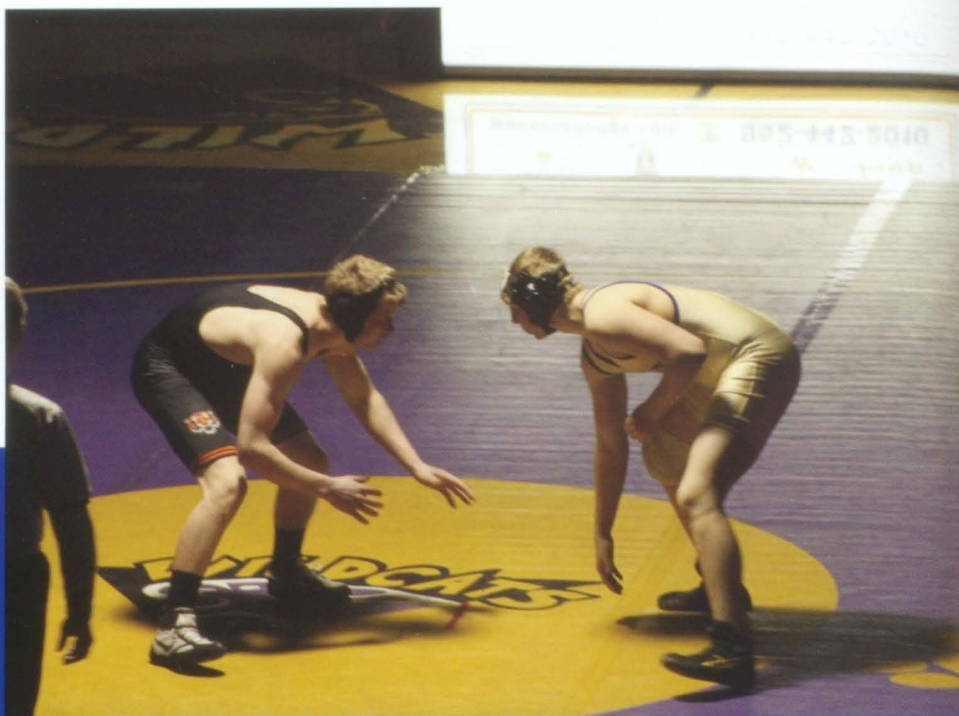
Practicing, competing, and encouragement brought the wrestlers together.

"Wrestling is more of a sport to make new friends, create a family, and gain more confidence in yourself," said junior Austin Millender.

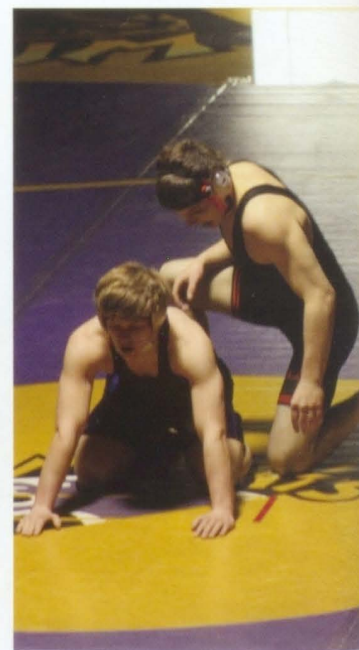
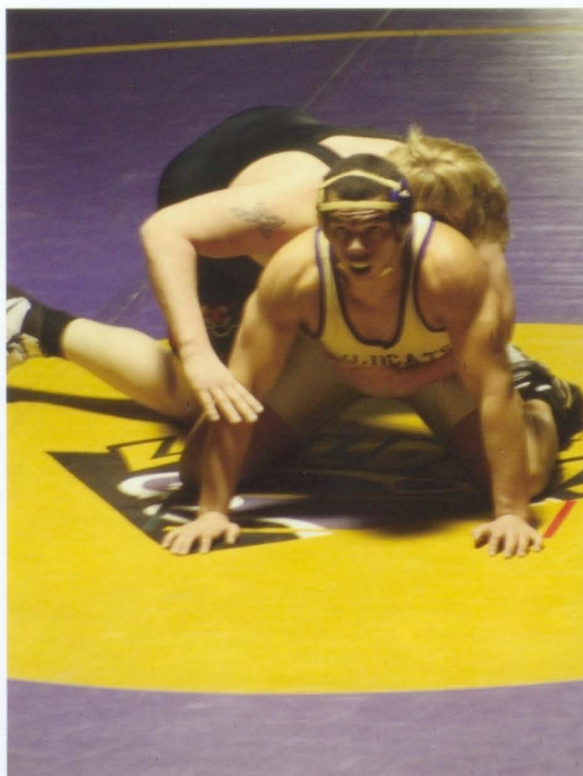

"One of the most challenging things in wrestling is keeping your composure, but having the family there for support makes it a whole lot easier," said Lynn.

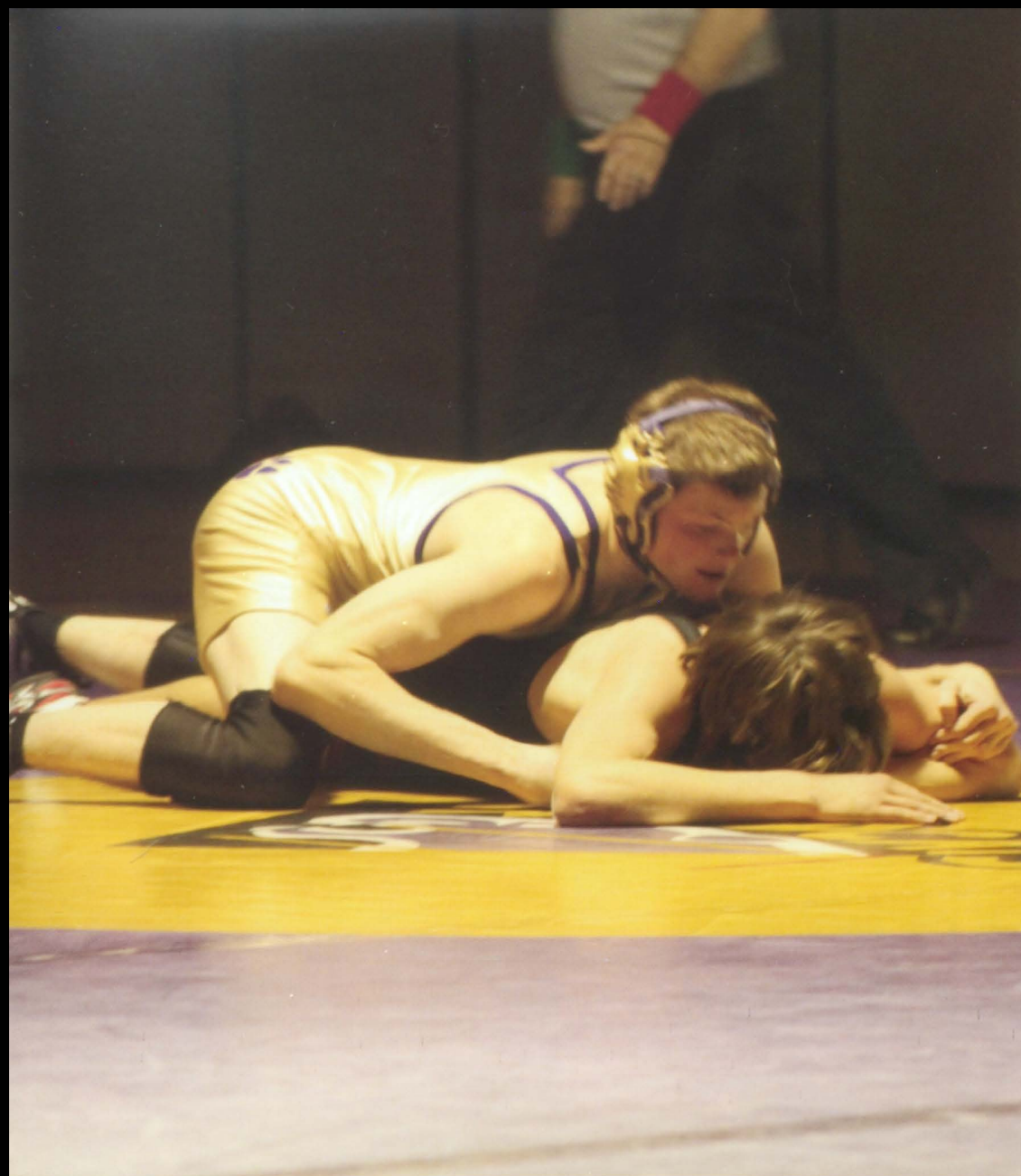

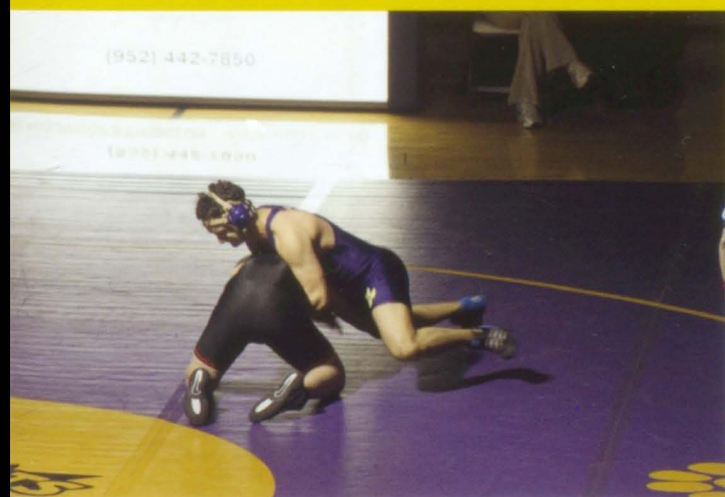

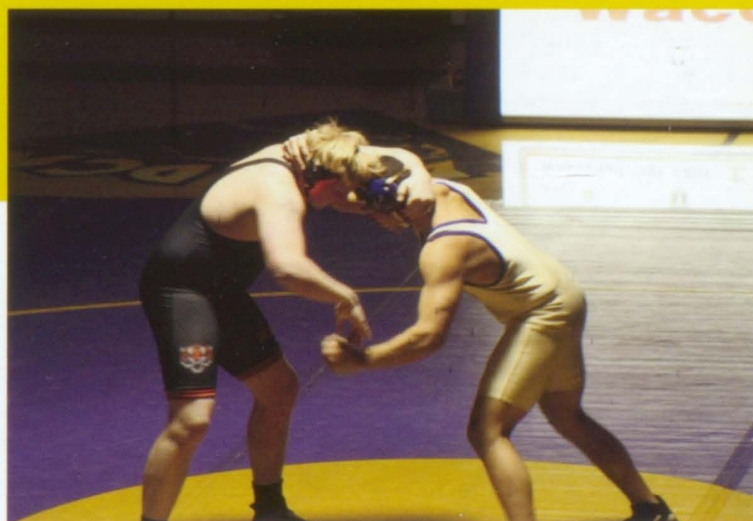

Even though the team didn't finish higher at state than the previous year, the team scores have greatly improved since last year.

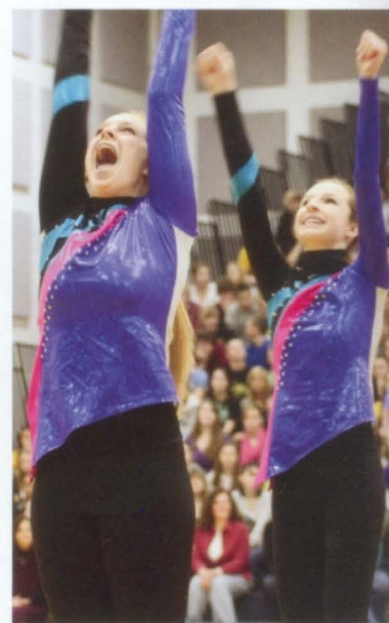
Preparing for a competition is very important. Each dancer must be comfortable dancing. By the end of the season, the team's unity was obvious.

"Everyone did a great job this year and we all had a lot of fun being together and making life long friends," said senior Turi Hjelsand.



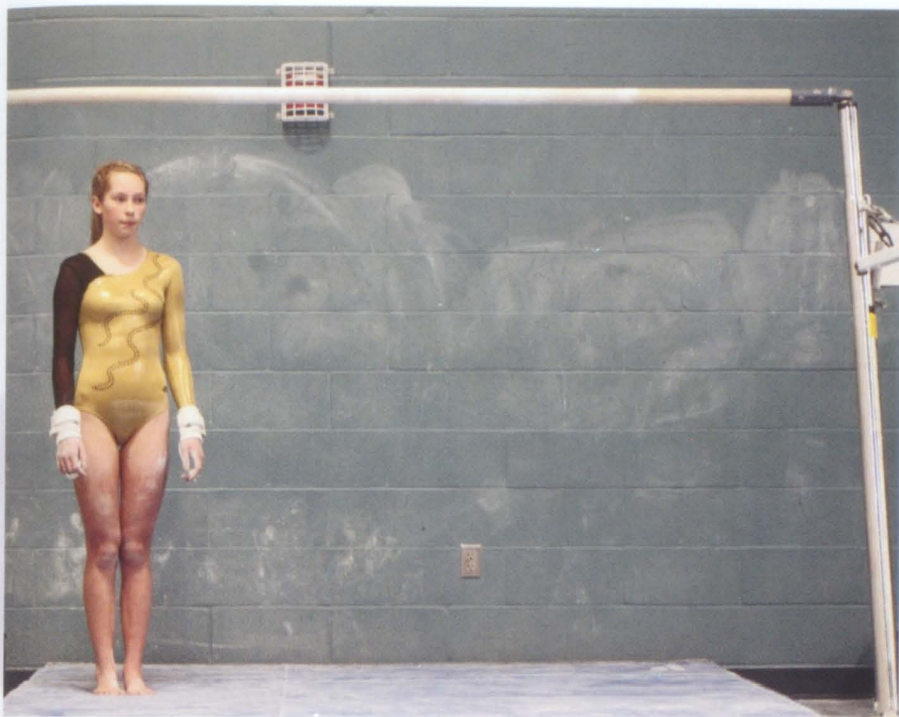

i have been in yearbook since my freshman year, but this was my first year being an editor. emma and i put a lot of time and thought into making this yearbook one that people would love.

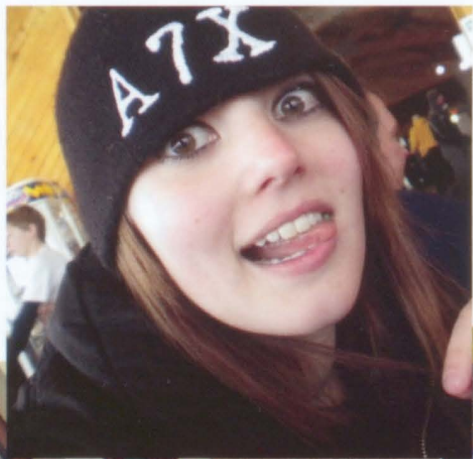
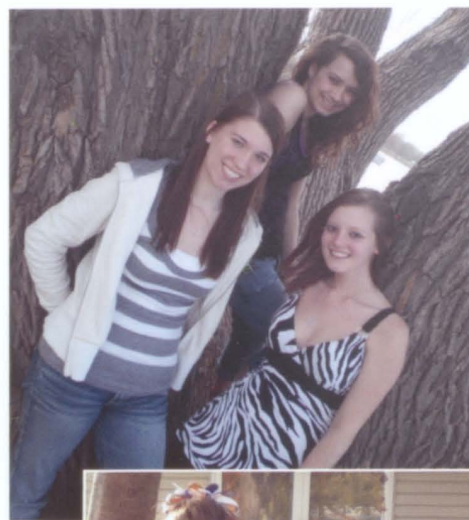
