# Memory Makers 



Above Left: Some of the WHS faculty show off school colors in a picture from the early 2000s. Mr. David Aeling, Mr. Robert Lindemann, Mrs. Amy Fischer, and Mrs. Kathy Kurtz were all employed when the current building opened for the 1994-1995 school year. They were $24,29,25$, and 25 years old, respectively, when they began teaching at Waconia High School.

Above Right: Mrs. Pam Melchert holds a sheet in front of a student in order to initiate a short story in French. Melchert has been teaching for twenty-eight years and says that she enjoys it because she gets to "see the same students year after year and is rewarded by their growth." She not only teaches at the high school but Clearwater Middle School as well.

Right: Mrs. Amy Fischer demonstrates a clay technique for her art class. The art classrooms weren't finished when the building opened, so in order to use the kiln, Fischer and her ceramic students were bused to the former Clearwater Middle School building, now Bayview Elementary. Her other art courses were taught in what is now Mr. Jensen's classroom. She didn't move into the new art classroom until after winter break.


Right: Mrs. Mary Ellen Timmers, Mrs. Kathy Hoese, and Mrs. Judy Rademacher are the three staff members who witnessed the opening of the current building. They remember what it was like to keep track of students, staff, and materials without the kind of technology we have today. In 1994, there were fewer than 500 students in grades $9-12$; in 2014, the enrollment was 1139. Timmers, the Activities Department administrative assistant, said she loves how "the school chemistry has changed... more diversity and more opportunity for everyone."

# Some Teachers and Staff Were Just Meant to Last 

Right: Mr. Kim Benson and Mr. Patrick Foley are two of the twelve teachers and staff who were present when the current building opened. Foley, who teaches health and safety education, sees freshmen and sophomores most often in his classroom. Benson sees mainly juniors and seniors and teaches theater, video production, Composition 12, Performance Media, and Advanced Placement Literature courses. Even though Foley and Benson teach two different subjects on opposite ends of the high school building, they have both been teaching for forty-one
 years.

Right: Mr. Clark Machtemes introduces a new century to his Advanced Placement World History students. He began teaching at Waconia High School when he was 26 years old and said that though he misses the past, he welcomes the technological changes in communication and delivery. Besides teaching, Machtemes enjoys rock climbing, traveling, and performing with his band, Traveled Ground.

Below Left: Mr. Mark Grundhofer, Mrs. Kathy Kurtz, Ms. Sharon Singsaas, and Mr. Tim Sauer comprised the entire math department in the mid-1990s. Prior to becoming principal, Fredericksen taught social studies and served as an assistant principal in District 110. He also taught at Harris-Lake Park High School in Iowa. During his career, Fredericksen has coached baseball, wrestling, and girls golf as well as served as prom advisor. He has also been a drivers education instructor.
