#### Drivers Education: Classroom Instruction

This summer Community Education will be offering the classroom instruction needed for Drivers Education. Participants need to complete 30 hours of classroom training before being issued a permit. Students must be 14 years of age to take the classroom instruction. Upon successful completion of the required 30 hours of classroom training a "Purple Completion Slip" is issued. This Purple Completion Slip must be presented in order to receive a "Blue Card". The "Blue Card" allows the student to take the Minnesota State Permit test. There is no course credit given to students who take this class during the summer thru Community Education. Online registration for classroom only.

The combo fee is for only people that have taken the summer classroom class. If participants register for both the classroom and the behind the wheel portion at the same time you can save \$50.

## Drivers Education: Behind the Wheel

Participants who have successfully completed classroom training sessions and have been issued a permit, are eligible for 6 hours of behind the wheel training. To register for behind the wheel training, the registration form should be submitted, in person, along with payment and the letter verifying completion of the 30 hours of classroom instruction to the CE office. The blue card will then be issued. Students need this card in order to complete a computerized permit test at the DMV. The date of their 16th birthday, along with the date of registration, will determine their priority on the waiting list. Please do not schedule your driver's test before you start your 6 hours of behind the wheel. If you are in an after school activity, please be aware that this limits your scheduling availability with the instructors. Fee: \$335

Fee Payment Options:

- 1. The entire fee paid at the time of registration.
- 2. \$167.50 at the time of registration and \$167.50 prior to your last behind the wheel lesson.

# 5th Grade Beginning Band Startup Camp 5th grade (2018-2019) bands will have their annual begin-

ning start up camp August 20th, 21st, and 23rd. (M, T, Th). This 3-day camp is the beginning of instruction for 5th grade band students - ALL first year band students should attend this camp. Students will receive a one hour class in like-instrument groups each day for 3 days. District 110 band directors will teach each class, assisted by WHS band students. Students will learn how to assemble and care for their instruments, correctly hold the instrument, produce a characteristic sound & play several notes.
