Our goal is to carry out a reopening plan that prioritizes the health, safety, and well-being of our school community during the COVID-19 pandemic.

HEALTH & SAFETY additional screening protocols





Students and staff should stay home and **notify the attendance line or the school's health office** under the following conditions:

You have tested positive for COVID-19 OR Someone in your household is experiencing symptoms OR Someone in your household is awaiting COVID-19 test results

If a student feels sick at home or at school, parents and teachers will follow the **What if a Student Feels Sick?** decision tree.

If a ISD110 Staff member feels sick at home or at school, they will follow the **COVID-19 Protocols for ISD 110 Employees** decision tree.

HEALTH & SAFETY SUSPECTED CASE OF COVID-19



Each building will have a designated, isolated space for suspected cases of COVID-19.

After evaluation, individuals with symptoms consistent with COVID-19 will be immediately isolated and sent home. Transportation will be provided as needed.

MDH guidance will be followed for notifying staff, families and the public, as needed, if a person with COVID-19 was on school premises. This will be done while maintaining confidentiality in accordance with FERPA and all other state and federal laws.

If COVID-19 is diagnosed, ISD110 will follow MDH guidelines to determine a safe time for the student to return to the school setting.

HEALTH & SAFETY school building access



Entry to school buildings will be restricted to staff and students.

Parents will be asked to make appointments for in-person meetings or participate in meetings online.

If student supplies or materials need to be dropped off, school buildings will designate an area where materials can be placed, labeled, and delivered to the student.



To maintain a safe learning environment, school volunteers and high school mentors will not be allowed until further notice.



No vendors will be admitted to the buildings without an appointment.

HEALTH & SAFETY social distancing



Classroom spaces will be rearranged to meet 50% capacity guidelines as outlined by the Fire Marshal.

To prevent large gatherings, furniture and seating spaces will be rearranged in common areas.

Visual cues for social distancing will be provided in common spaces (i.e. reception areas, hallways, restrooms, etc.).

School entrance and exit procedures will be established.

HEALTH & SAFETY personal hygiene protocols



We will explicitly teach and carry out routines for frequent hygiene:

- Arrival and dismissal
- Before, during, and after preparing or eating food
- After using the bathroom
- After blowing one's nose, coughing, or sneezing
- After touching objects with bare hands that have been handled by other people

We will provide supplies to support healthy hygiene behaviors. This includes items such as soap, hand sanitizing stations, paper towels, disinfectant wipes, tissues, etc.

We will provide adequate supplies to minimize sharing of high touch materials to the extent possible.

If equipment must be shared, we will clean and disinfect between each use.

We will discourage sharing of items that are difficult to clean or disinfect.

HEALTH & SAFETY ENVIRONMENTAL CLEANING AND FACILITY UPGRADES



During school hours, we will routinely clean high touch surfaces.

After school hours, we will clean and disinfect classrooms and common areas.

ISD110 has inspected and enhanced (to the extent possible) air handling systems in all buildings to increase fresh air flow and to improve filtration.



Plexiglass or plastic dividers have been installed in reception areas where social distancing is not able to be maintained.



ISD110 will follow guidance from the Environmental Protection Agency regarding safe and effective chemical usage.

HEALTH & SAFETY masks and face coverings





- ISD110 is required to follow <u>Emergency</u> <u>Executive Order 20-81</u> which mandates all K-12 students, staff, and visitors to wear a mask or face covering while in any of our buildings.
- All E-12 staff are required are required to wear masks or face coverings when providing direct services to students.
- Children under the age of 5 are not required to wear a mask when attending class.
- Students with severe medical and special needs may be exempt from mask protocols and school staff will work with the families of students who fall into this category.
- Face masks or face coverings may be temporarily removed for eating or drinking, or while playing a mouth-based musical instrument.

- In a safe manner, where 12 feet social distancing can be maintained, face mask breaks will be provided on a periodic basis.
- Students refusing to wear face coverings will face progressive disciplinary measures and, those not conforming, may be moved to the distance learning model of instruction.
- Information on the proper way to wear a face covering, which face coverings are acceptable, and which ones are not acceptable can be found at <u>MDH</u>
 <u>Face Covering Requirements and</u> <u>Recommendations</u>.
- One cloth face covering per student and staff member will be provided by the state. We are suggesting that parents treat student masks as a school supply this year.

OPERATIONS cafeteria and lunch procedures



- Elementary students will eat lunch in their classrooms with a designated area for students with food allergies.
- Students at WMS and WHS will eat lunch in the cafeteria. These spaces will be rearranged for social distancing and students may eat together in small groups.
- Lunch lines with visual cues and check-out protocols will be in place to ensure social distancing.



 All K-12 meals will be packaged in recyclable "Grab 'n Go" containers with a cup of fresh milk.

- Meals can be purchased on days when students are not in the school building. These meals must be preordered.
- Students may bring a snack and lunch from home.
- No self-service food or beverage options will be allowed for students or staff.
- Food sharing events including potlucks, classroom celebrations, or birthday celebrations will be suspended.
- Tables and chairs will be cleaned in between use.

OPERATIONS CHILDCARE



- Kids' Company will be available for grades K-5 at all elementary school sites.
- Preschool care will be provided at the Early Childhood Center.
- If full-time distance learning becomes necessary, priority will be given in this order:
 - » Children of Tier 1 employees
 - » Currently registered families
 - » New registrations based on the availability of staff and space

- Tier I employees are defined as:
 - » Healthcare and public health
 - » Law enforcement, public safety and first responders
 - » Food and agriculture
 - » Judicial Branch (essential services)
 - » National Guard (activated under a Governor Executive Order)
 - » Educators and school staff providing in-person instruction or caring for children of critical workers
 - » Child care and school-age care providers
- Children of Tier 1 employees will receive free child care during the normal school day for grades K-5. If before and after school care is needed as well as pre-existing non-school days, fees will be charged.
- Kids' Company hours are 6:00 am 6:15 pm and **pre-registration is required**.

OPERATIONS TRANSPORTATION





- Per MDH guidelines, bus transportation may proceed at 50% capacity. To the extent possible, and to assist in meeting this requirement, we are asking that parents provide their own transportation.
- If riding the bus, the following safety protocols will be in place:
 - » All students must wear a mask while on the bus.
 - » Drivers will be masked when passengers are on board.
 - » One student per seat unless students live in the same household.
 - » Hand sanitizer will be available on request for students to use.
 - » Drivers will have extra masks available for students who forget.
 - » Buses will be disinfected between routes and deep cleaned once daily.
 - » Drivers will self-assess using the **COVID-19 Symptom Screening Tool** and have temperatures checked before work.
 - » Areas for bus drivers to congregate at the bus garage will be closed.

ACADEMICS & INSTRUCTION LEARNING MODELS



The ISD110 fall reopening plan allows families to select from two learning models:

Hybrid learning model - This model must meet health, safety and operation guidelines as previously outlined in this document. We have designed the district plan around providing our youngest students in grades K-6 with the most time in school. Grades 7-12 are in a blended learning model with students assigned to an every other day schedule.

Full time distance learning model - This model is open to all ISD110 learners and is an enhanced distance learning format from home. Meals will be available to students participating in distance learning via curbside pick-up.

ACADEMICS & INSTRUCTION TECHNOLOGY SUPPORT



District 110 has put into place a technology plan which strives to leverage technology for effective and efficient instructional methods. Based on local and state feedback the district has committed to increasing the consistency of online tools for a more efficient and effective experience for students and parents during both on-site and distance learning. The learning management system, Seesaw, will be used for activity distribution and communication in grades PreK-2. Schoology will be used for posting assignments, formative assessments, and turning in assignments in grades 3-12. Again, for ease of use and familiarity the district has chosen to use Zoom for any virtual meetings, classes or live streaming.

District 110's technology plan is built on a Bring Your Own Device (BYOD) 1:1 program. Equity is at the forefront of this plan as it offers any student who chooses to borrow a district-owned device for use 24/7. Hotspots are also available for families to request if internet access is not available to the family.



If a family need to **borrow a device (form)** or a **hotspot (form)** they would complete and submit the respective form and pick up the device in the Media Center of the building they attend.
