Choice: Do I have real choices about what, when, and how I will learn and demonstrate my competence?


**Challenge:** Do I feel appropriately challenged in my learning and work?

To be heard.


To be befriended, needed, and loved.

## 7:40 – 7:50 a.m. ARRIVAL: Morning Student Drop-off and Recess with playground supervision

We encourage <u>all</u> students to participate in morning recess. This gives children an opportunity to socialize with friends, play, and get some fresh air. It's a healthy way to start the school day!

## Morning Parent Drop Off

Location: Southview Parking Lot

Time: 7:40 - 7:50 a.m.

In order for morning parent drop off to go quickly and smoothly, please do the following:

- 1. Enter the SV Parking Lot via 5th Street & Willow Street.
- 2. Stop at the orange cones.
- 3. Students will get out of his/her car on their own and go directly to the playground for morning recess. In case of inclement weather, students will go directly into the school via the Parking Lot Door 17.
- 4. Parents remain in your cars and keep the line moving efficiently and quickly.

\*Please note: With the large volume of Parent Drop off, please teach your child(ren) to get out of his/her car on their own. Opening the car door slows down the line. Practicing drop off is very important so our children can feel comfortable and confident. Thank you for being safe and patient!

#### 7:50 a.m.

Students enter the school building.

#### 8:00 a.m.

Video Morning Announcements begin.

Monday Video Announcements will be emailed to all Southview Families.

Students must be seated in the classroom for student announcements in order to be on time for school.

## 2:30 p.m. Student Dismissal

Busses leave the school by 2:30 p.m.

Teachers walk their students to the buses every day.

## 2:30 - 2:40 p.m. Parent/Guardian Pick Up is in the East Commons

Please park in the SV Parking lot and enter the building to pick up your child(ren).

We will unlock the doors to the East Commons at 2:30 p.m.



## **READING IS VERY IMPORTANT!**

MANDATORY: All students must have a book in their backpacks at all times!

## **SAFETY AT SOUTHVIEW**

Safety is a priority at all District ONE10 schools!

When you visit Southview Elementary please enter through the office, sign in and put on a visitor name tag. If visiting the classroom, please make an appointment with your classroom teacher. Please sign out in the office when leaving. Thank you!

## 8:00 A.M.: ENTRY DOORS LOCKED

Students enter school at 7:50 a.m.

At 8:00 a.m. all entry doors are locked. SV Day Lead Custodian does a daily check to ensure all entry doors are locked. All staff are responsible to ensure all entry doors are locked throughout the day.

## INTERIOR DOORS LOCKED

All interior doors are locked at all times.

A magnet is used on each door for efficiency in accessing the door.

All staff are responsible for ensuring his/her door can be locked and the door has a magnet.

## **STUDENT SUPPLIES DROP OFF**

A table is available in the vestibule for student supplies drop off. Please leave the item with your child's name on the table. The office staff will ensure the item is delivered to your child in a timely manner.

## **WALKIE TALKIE**

Walkie Talkies are available in all classrooms located by an entry door. Staff must have a walkie talkie when on the playground with students.

## **FIELD TRIPS**

Our classroom teachers always ensure the SV Office has an accurate cell phone number of all teachers prior to leaving for a field trip.

## **NO PARKING ZONES**

For the safety of our students, always use the SV Parking Lot for drop-off and pick-up. Please do not park in the bus zones. Throughout the day buses and vans continue to use the bus zones for field trips, special activities, and special classes.

## **LANYARDS AND BADGES**

All staff at Southview wear either a Lanyard or Badge. Students are taught to look for the lanyard or badge if they are seeking assistance from an adult. Badges are color coded for the following:

- Visitor Name tag all guests/parents/guardians

## **SCHOOL EMERGENCY PLAN**

We are committed to maintaining an environment of safety and security for our students, staff, parents, and public. We regularly participate in the following drills throughout the year:

## **FIRE CHIEF AND SHERIFF**

## **EXPANDED LEARNING OPPORTUNITIES**

## **TECHNOLOGY IN CLASSROOMS**

All students Grades K-4 will have access to one electronic device per 2 students for school use. The devices will remain in school and will be used by students under the supervision of our school staff.

## **SPECIALIST CLASSES**

Southview offers our learners experiences in Art, Music, Physical Education, Spanish, Media, Technology, and Social Skills. **Tennis shoes are required for PE classes.** Bring your tennis shoes to school every day or keep a pair in your locker.

## **AUTHOR AND WRITING RESIDENCY**

K-2 learners will have the opportunity to experience author visits. Grade 3-5 learners will have the opportunity to expand their writing skills with a one week writing residency. Residencies are sponsored by the Southview PTO.

## **FIELD TRIP PLAN**

A field trip is considered to be a learning experience directly related to the curriculum. Each grade level is scheduled for a field trip during the school year. At Southview, we are extending our field trip program by giving our students an experience with the arts. Students will have the opportunity to attend a play or a music concert. These field trips will be determined as the year progresses. The classroom teacher will provide further information and details as students prepare for their field trip.

## **SCHOOL T-SHIRT**

All learners and staff wear our school T-shirt for the Fall Fundraiser, Caring Heart Days, Field Trips, and Track & Field.

# ASSESSMENTS, PROGRESS, AND TIMELY FEEDBACK

All Southview students are assessed formally in reading, math, and social-emotional behavior three times per year (fall, winter, spring).

Progress is monitored regularly.

Formal assessment data is shared with parents at Parent/Teacher conferences in November and February.

## SCHEDULING YOUR PARENT/TEACHER CONFERENCE

Parent/Teacher conference scheduling is done using Pick-A-Time software.

You will receive an email from Pick-A-Time with instructions on how to schedule your conferences.

## **REPORT CARDS**

Our school has a trimester reporting period. You can view your child's report card online at the end of each trimester in the Infinite Campus Family Portal.

Along with the report card, the following assessments will be administered to accurately monitor student achievement. These assessments will allow teachers the opportunity to identify the strengths and areas of growth for each learner and provide accurate re-teach and/or expanded experiences.

## **CAFE 110 - BREAKFAST AND LUNCH PROGRAM**

## **SCHOOLWIDE BREAKFAST**

CAFE 110 Breakfast Bar is available for all students.

Kindergarten: FREE

Grades 1-5: Cost will be deducted from the student's Cafe 110 account.

All students receive a 15 minute morning break daily between 8:30 a.m. - 10:15 a.m. (exact time subject to change due to field trips, school programs, etc.).

## **SCHOOLWIDE SNACK TIME**

Each classroom has a 15 minutes Snack Break Time in their schedule. Students bring a healthy snack to school every day.

## **SCHOOL LUNCH**

Students may bring a healthy lunch from home or access the school lunch program. Lunch cost will be deducted from the student's Cafe 110 account.

## **GUEST LUNCHES**

If you would like to eat school lunch please call the office by 9:00 a.m. to reserve a lunch. The guest lunch fee can be paid in the SV Office. Reservations are required to ensure lunch availability.

# STUDENT HEALTH

All medication (inhalers, medicine, cough drops, etc.) should be brought directly to the nurse's office.

If your child has a fever or vomits, school policy states the student must stay home for 24 hours after the fever breaks or the last episode of vomiting.

If you are not sure of whether to send your child to school due to illness, please call Nurse Whitney at 952-442-0623.

When a student loses a tooth at school he/she will visit the nurse for a tooth necklace.

Please notify and ensure our Health Office is fully informed about your child's medical history and current medical diagnosis and medication at all times. Thank you for keeping us updated for the safety of your child.
