

Early Childhood Family Education (ECFE) is a District 110 Community Education program of Waconia Public Schools. All families with children ages birth to kindergarten are welcome. Our mission is to strengthen families through education, and support all parents toward healthy growth and development of their children.

Early Childhood Family Education offers classes, events and other programs designed by highly qualified teachers, specifically for families with young children. Most classes meet once a week for 1.5-2 hours. Quality child care is provided for siblings not enrolled in class.

A sliding fee scale is provided to make classes affordable for all families. No one will be denied participation for inability to pay.

Incredible Infants

Having a baby is both exciting and challenging. This informative class helps you to get off to a great start with your baby. You will meet with other parents to discuss common concerns such as sleep, feeding, adjusting to parenthood, infant development and more. Spend time enjoying music, playing, and bonding with your child. **Parents and children will stay together the entire class.** You are welcome to join an infant class at any time during the session or during your maternity leave as space allows. - Parent/Child Time Parents and children explore age-appropriate activities designed to enhance learning. Parents gain new ideas for things to do together at home with their children. This time includes a group "Circle Time" of songs and games.
- Parent Education Licensed parent educators provide resources and guide group discussions about child development, parenting techniques and current issues concerning today's families.
- Children's Classroom During parent discussion, children play in a stimulating and caring environment with licensed early childhood teachers. ECFE Bridge to Preschool

A unique blend of parent-child time and peer group interaction offering an introductory preschool experience. Families registered for fall session will be given priority registration for winter/spring session. We are offering two sessions, Monday/Wednesday and Tuesday/Thursday.



Monday/Tuesday is Parent-Child Day: On this day parents must attend with their child. The first hour is an opportunity for play, modeling social interactions, and participating in your child's learning. The second hour we separate for a fun, educational parent discussion around supporting development. Sibling care is available for this day each week.

Wednesday/Thursday is Child-Only Day: The second day each week is a drop off day where your child will interact with peers, led by a licensed early childhood teacher and an assistant. An introduction to basic skills, along with music, a story and gym/outdoor time are included each day. Children will follow a typical preschool schedule and learn basic routines and expectations in preparation for preschool. Children working towards toilet training are welcomed to attend. Parents must send a nut free bag lunch to eat during the Monday/Wednesday class. The Tuesday/Thursday class will need to bring a nut free snack.

Child must be 33 months by January 1, 2023. Class fees are payable in two equal payments. ECFE Room 108.

An offering for parents of Kindergarten age children. The Elementary Schools of District 110 invite you to have lunch with your Kindergarten child and learn with us!

Join your child for a school lunch or bring your own. When children join their friends for recess you join other kindergarten parents for a supportive discussion about raising our children. Bring your parenting questions and your ideas to share. Discussion is facilitated by a Licensed Parent Educator. Each elementary building hosts this event 3 times per year; join us once or throughout the year.

Registration is FREE through Early Childhood Family Education/School Age Offerings. Sibling care provided \$6.00/child. Registration Required. School lunch is an extra cost for adults who choose this option. Lunch costs will be added to the students lunch account.

Early Childhood Screening


Is your child 3 years old?

The early childhood years are an important time of rapid learning and growth. Early Childhood Screening is a **FREE** service offered by District 110 that will check a child's overall development and health. Children are screened by a licensed early childhood teacher

and a school nurse. Results of the screening help identify any learning or health concerns that may require attention before a child enters kindergarten. In Minnesota all children are required to complete Early Childhood Screening before kindergarten entrance, however, it is not a test for kindergarten. The preferred age to screen is between the ages of 3 and 4 years old.

Early Childhood Screening includes:

- * A look at your child's development
- *Vision and hearing checks
- * Height and weight measurements
- * Immunization and health history review

Minnesota law requires that all children attending District 110 Early Childhood classes have their immunizations up to date. Proof of immunization must be presented. If you need information on low cost or free immunizations for your child, call Carver County Public Health Services at 952-361-1329.
