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

Our mission is to strengthen families through education and support of all parents as their child's first and most important teacher.

ECFE offers classes, special events and other programs designed to give parents information, resources and skills that support their child's growth and development. Most classes meet once a week for 1.5-2 hours at a time. Quality childcare is provided for siblings not enrolled in class.

A sliding fee scale is provided to make classes affordable for all families. No one will be denied participation for inability to pay.

Having a new baby is both exciting and challenging. This relaxing and informative class helps you to get off to a great start with your baby. 
Early Childhood Screening

Is your child $3\frac{1}{2}$ years old?

The early childhood years are an important time of rapid learning and growth. Early Childhood Screening is a FREE service offered by District 110 that will check a child's overall development and health. Children are screened by a licensed early childhood teacher and a school nurse. Results of the screening help identify any learning or health concerns that may require attention before a child enters kindergarten. In Minnesota all children are required to complete Early Childhood Screening before kindergarten entrance, however, it is not a test for kindergarten. The preferred age to screen is between the ages of 3 1/2 and 4 years old.

Early Childhood Screening includes:

- * A look at your child's development
- *Vision and hearing checks
- * Height and weight measurements
- * Immunization and health history review
